Your Verse

Day 2: God's Self-Disclosure to Humanity

Devotional: God's Eternal 'I AM' Reveals His Existence

God's name reveals His eternal, unchanging nature and existence beyond time. When God identified Himself to Moses as "I AM," He declared that He is the self-existent One who always was and always will be. This name signals that God is not dependent on anything else for His existence.

Jesus echoed this name during His ministry, affirming His divine identity. In John 8:58, Jesus claims, "before Abraham was born, I am!" He connects Himself to the eternal "I AM," showing God's continued revelation in human form.

God's self-disclosure helps us affirm that He is not a myth or concept but a living being. His presence is real and active, inviting relationship. Reflect on what it means that God is the "I AM," the One who transcends time and space, unchanging through all history.

Devotional: Conscience Reflects God's Moral Law Within

Our conscience acts as a witness to a moral law embedded deep within us, pointing beyond mere cultural norms. Romans 2:14–15 explains that even those without God's written law recognize, by nature, right and wrong. This internal moral compass suggests a Lawgiver whose standards are written on our hearts.

God's law is not just rules on a page but a reflection of His character placed within us. Psalm 51 highlights God's desire for inner truth, and Jeremiah promises that God will write His law on our hearts, enabling us to understand and live according to His will.

This innate sense of right and wrong is a form of evidence for God's existence. It points to a Creator who has designed us with moral awareness and purposes beyond ourselves.

Devotional: Jesus Fulfills Prophecies Confirming God's Plan

The Bible contains numerous specific prophecies written centuries before Jesus's birth that He fulfilled in remarkable detail. Isaiah 53 describes the suffering servant who would bear our sins. The prophecy foretells the pain and sacrifice Jesus endured, affirming His divine mission.

Micah pinpointed Bethlehem as the Messiah's birthplace long before Jesus arrived. Psalm 22 vividly depicts aspects of the crucifixion, including piercing hands and feet. These fulfilled prophecies provide strong evidence that Jesus is God's promised Savior and not a man who simply claimed divinity.

Consider how these fulfilled prophecies build a case for God's existence and faithfulness to His promises. The detailed nature of these predictions and their fulfillment testify not to human invention but divine orchestration.

God communicated His truth through prophets, revealing His existence and purposes. 2 Peter affirms prophecy originates from God, delivered through human instruments guided by the Spirit.

Amos highlights that God doesn't act without first revealing to His prophets. Jeremiah's calling emphasizes God's intentional relationship and knowledge before birth.

The prophetic witness throughout Scripture demonstrates God's ongoing involvement in world events and human affairs. It assures us that God is real and active beyond what we see.
