Devotional: Recognizing Christ's Supreme Authority

Colossians 1:15–20 offers one of the most majestic descriptions of Christ in all Scripture. Paul reveals that Jesus is the *image of the invisible God*, indicating His divine nature and essential unity with the Father. This passage asserts His supremacy over creation — not merely as a created being but as the **firstborn over all creation**, holding authority over every aspect of the universe.

In this profound theology, we see Jesus not just as a historical figure but as the eternal King through whom and for whom everything was created. His role as reconciler through the cross is the pivotal action that restores harmony between God and humanity. Paul urges believers to reflect on the greatness of Christ to counter false teachings threatening the Colossian church.

Today, let's recognize Christ's sovereignty and reflect on how fully our lives submit to His lordship. Do we see Him as supreme over our daily decisions and challenges? Understanding Christ's supremacy is foundational; it shapes our identity and grounds our faith firmly against any false doctrine.

Devotional: Embracing Our New Life in Christ

Colossians 3:1-4 emphasizes the reality that believers have been raised with Christ, signifying a radical transformation that redefines identity. This passage invites us to *set our hearts and minds on heavenly things* rather than the fleeting desires and values of the world. Our new identity is rooted in Christ's resurrection and the eternal life we now possess.

Paul describes a powerful exchange: the old self, characterized by sinful behaviors and attitudes, is put to death — replaced by a new self, renewed in knowledge and holiness. This transformation roots us in hope and purpose. It challenges us to reject former ways of thinking and to walk daily in the new life Christ provides.

Today, reflect on what it means to truly live as a new creation. Are there old habits or mindsets you need to put aside? Being 'raised with Christ' isn't merely a spiritual fact but a call to action, inviting you into the abundant and purposeful life that God desires.

Devotional: Living Out Christ's Character Daily

The final passage in our study beautifully paints the picture of how our new identity in Christ should transform the way we live and relate to others. Colossians 3:12–17 exhorts believers to put on virtues—compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience—like clothing, reflecting the character of Christ.

These fruits are the tangible evidence of an inward transformation caused by the Holy Spirit. Paul also encourages believers to let the peace of Christ rule in their hearts and to let the Word dwell richly among them, teaching and admonishing one another. Worship and gratitude are central to a transformed life marked by community and harmony.

This day challenges us to evaluate the quality of our daily walk. Are we exhibiting Christ-like virtues? Is our life a witness to the grace we have received? The call to transformation is ongoing — it requires intentionality, humility, and dependence on God's power each moment.

	In what ways does letting the Word dwell richly in you influence your actions?
	What steps can you take to foster peace and gratitude in your community?

1.	Reflect on which Christ-like qualities come most naturally to you and which need growth.
	Write about a recent situation where you practiced or struggled to show patience or kindness.
3.	List practical ways you can let Christ's peace rule in your heart starting today.
