Day 1: 💋 Finding Hope in Brokenness

Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 – "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 61:1 "He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted..."
- Romans 8:28 "...in all things God works for the good of those who love him..."







Day 1: **B** Finding Hope in Brokenness

Devotional: God is Near to Your Broken Heart

Divorce can leave you feeling shattered and discarded, but God draws close to those whose hearts are broken. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that the Lord is not distant or uncaring; He is near, offering comfort and healing to the crushed in spirit. When your world feels like it's falling apart, God meets you in that pain and begins to weave a new tapestry of hope.

Hope after loss may seem impossible, but God's promises are certain. Even in the darkest valleys, He binds up wounds and redeems our stories. This is not about denying pain but allowing God's presence to transform it into something beautiful.

Your Verse

Galatians 2:20 – "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come."
- Psalm 139:14 "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made."







Devotional: You Are a New Creation in Christ

Your identity is not defined by your past, your mistakes, or your marital status. Galatians 2:20 declares that when you trust in Christ, your old self dies and His life animates you. Divorce may have rocked your world, but your true identity is found in Jesus.

Many women wrestle with feelings of shame or worthlessness after divorce. Yet *God's Word reminds us that we are fearfully and wonderfully made*, handcrafted with purpose and infinite value. Your worth is inherent and eternal because you bear God's image.

Rebuilding your identity means embracing the new creation God offers, allowing Him to remove lies and replace them with truth. This foundation is unshakable and strengthens every area of life. Let go of labels that hurt, and cling to the eternal love that defines who you truly are.

Your Verse

Joel 2:25 - "I will restore to you the years that the swarming locust has eaten."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 43:18 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past."
- Jeremiah 30:17 "I will restore health to you and heal you of your wounds."







Devotional: God Restores What Was Lost

Divorce can feel like a season of loss and wasted time. Yet God's promise through Joel is powerful: He will restore the years lost. This means nothing in your story is wasted or beyond repair. God is the ultimate restorer who delights in making beauty from brokenness.

Restoration often requires us to let go of the past and trust a new future. Holding tightly to regret or bitterness only delays the healing process. God invites you to remember He is working, even when you don't see it, to bring health and wholeness.

Today, choose to release the pain you are holding onto and believe God's restoration is unfolding. Your future is being rewritten with His grace, and every step forward is part of His loving plan.

3.	Imagine your future restored by God and describe it.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for the promise of restoration. Help me to release the pain and bitterness of my past and trust You to heal and rebuild what has been lost. Renew my hope and fill me with peace as I walk into the future You have planned. I choose to forget the former things and embrace Your new mercies each day. *In Jesus' name, amen.*

















Day 4: V The Strength of Vulnerability

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 – "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted."
- Proverbs 3:5 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart..."







Day 4: V The Strength of Vulnerability

Devotional: God's Power Shines in Your Weakness

After divorce, it's natural to want to hide your pain and put on a brave face. But Scripture teaches us that vulnerability is a source of strength, not weakness. God's grace is made perfect in our weaknesses, meaning when we acknowledge we cannot do it alone, His power fills the gap.

Allowing yourself to be vulnerable before God and trusted people opens the door to authentic healing. It's in those honest moments that God's grace meets your deepest needs.

Today, embrace vulnerability as a step toward wholeness. Let go of the pressure to appear strong on your own, and rest in the knowledge that God's power is greatest when we are humble and broken.

Prayer for Today

Jesus, thank You that Your grace is enough for me even in my weakness. Help me to surrender my pride and fears, allowing Your power to shine through my brokenness. Teach me to be vulnerable and to trust You with all my heart. Surround me with supportive people who will walk alongside me in honesty and love. *In Your mighty name, amen.*

















Day 5: Kenewing Purpose and Calling

Your Verse

Jeremiah 29:11 - "For I know the plans I have for you... plans to prosper and not to harm you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 2:10 "We are God's handiwork... created for good works."
- Proverbs 16:3 "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans."







Day 5: Kenewing Purpose and Calling

Devotional: God's Plans Bring Hope and Purpose

Your life has purpose beyond your past relationships. Jeremiah 29:11 reminds you that God's plans for you include hope, prosperity, and a future brimming with meaning. Divorce does not define your destiny; God's calling does.

God created you with intention, equipped for good works prepared beforehand. This season is an opportunity to rediscover or deepen your purpose in Him and to commit all you do to His guidance.

Today, seek God's direction for your next steps. Pray for clarity and courage to pursue the calling He has placed on your life. Your future is bright because God leads with loving hands.

Your Verse

- Isaiah 55:1 "Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters."







Day 6: \(\sum_{\text{Living Water for Your Soul}} \)

Devotional: Jesus Satisfies Your Deepest Thirst

After divorce, emotional thirst and emptiness are common experiences. The woman at the well in John 4 met Jesus in her brokenness and received living water that satisfied her deepest needs forever.

Jesus invites you to come as you are and drink deeply from His grace and love. This living water renews your spirit, refreshes your soul, and promises no more thirst.

Today, seek to nurture your soul with time in God's presence, prayer, and His Word. Let His living water cleanse your wounds and restore your joy. Your soul's deepest thirst finds fulfillment only in Him.
