#### Devotional: When God's Storms Interrupt Our Plans

#### Devotional: Responding to Crisis with Faith

The sailors face a terrifying storm and seek the cause through casting lots, which reveals Jonah as the source. Their honest and desperate action shows a willingness to confront the truth even in fear. This reminds us that when disaster strikes, the way we respond matters deeply.

Fear can lead us to panic, blame, or denial. Yet, these men look beyond the immediate crisis and recognize a spiritual cause. Faith begins when we admit our limitations and turn toward God's wisdom.

Likewise, in our life's storms, are we willing to honestly face our circumstances and seek God's guidance? Or do we try to navigate alone? The sailors' example invites us to bring our fears to God and trust in His deliverance, even when the way forward is uncertain.

#### Devotional: Turning to God in Our Deepest Despair

Jonah's confession begins in the darkest place—inside the belly of the fish. This moment of surrender shows how even in our lowest depths, we can find God by turning to Him in prayer. Jonah acknowledges his distress, remembers God's faithfulness, and calls out for rescue.

Prayer is our lifeline during spiritual storms. It connects us to God's power and grace, offering hope amid despair. Jonah's prayer is both a cry for help and an affirmation of trust, demonstrating humility and repentance.

## Devotional: Freedom Found Through Obedience
