Explore the story of Samaria's siege and the starving mothers, uncovering faith, desperation, and God's provision.





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Introduction

The story of the siege of Samaria, as recorded in **2 Kings 6:24–7:20**, is a profound account of human desperation, faith, and the power of God's intervention. When the Syrian army surrounded the city of Samaria, the people inside faced extreme famine, to the point that even mothers considered unspeakable acts to survive. This harrowing period is not only a sobering reminder of the consequences of warfare but also a testament to God's ability to deliver and provide — even when hope seems lost.

In this 7-day Bible study plan, we will journey through this story and its profound lessons. We will reflect on faith tested by hardship, the power of God to restore, and how divine deliverance often comes through unexpected means. We will also explore how God's providence addresses our deepest needs when we trust Him unconditionally.

Each day offers Scripture, supportive verses, and practical devotional thoughts designed to help you walk with God in times of crisis. As we look at the starving mothers and the desperate city, we will come to see that no matter the siege we face — whether physical, emotional, or spiritual — God's hand is always ready to save and provide.

Let this study encourage and challenge you to persevere, be faithful, and look for God's miraculous work in every difficulty. Together, let's see how our God reigns supreme even when circumstances say otherwise.

















Day 1: The Siege Begins: Facing Dire Crisis

Your Verse

2 Kings 6:24 NIV - "After some time, Ben-Hadad king of Aram mobilized his entire army and marched up to besiege Samaria. They laid siege to it and built a siege wall around it."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: The Siege Begins: Facing Dire Crisis

Devotional: God's Presence in Our Darkest Moments

Facing crises can leave us feeling trapped and hopeless. The people of Samaria experienced this firsthand as the Syrian army surrounded their city, cutting off food and safety. Imagine the fear, the uncertainty, and the desperation mounting day by day as supplies dwindled.

Yet, even in the darkest moments, the Lord is near. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is close to those who are brokenhearted. When the siege began, the Israelites might have felt completely alone, but God's presence never left them. Our challenges may sometimes seem overwhelming, but God promises His unwavering support.

As you consider your own 'sieges' — whether external conflicts or internal battles — remember that God invites you to lean on Him. The first step in any crisis is to acknowledge our need for God's strength and presence.

Prayer for Today

Lord, in my times of trouble, help me to remember that You are always near.

When fear surrounds me and hope seems lost, infuse my heart with peace that comes only from You. Strengthen my faith to trust in Your presence, even when I cannot see the way forward. Thank You for being my refuge and my rock. Teach me to lean into You intentionally today and every day. *In Jesus'* name, Amen.







Day 2: Starvation and Sorrow: The Depths of Despair









Your Verse

2 Kings 6:25 NIV - "There was a great famine in the city; the siege lasted so long that a donkey's head sold for eighty shekels of silver, and a fourth of a cab of seed pods for five shekels."

Supporting Scriptures

- Lamentations 3:19–20 "I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall. I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me."
- Psalm 42:11 "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God..."







Devotional: Hope in the Midst of Desperate Sorrow

The siege brought famine so severe that food prices became exorbitant, and desperation led to dark thoughts, especially among starving mothers who faced unthinkable choices. Their sorrow is a piercing reminder of how suffering can push people to the edge.

God sees every tear and knows our pain. The book of Lamentations captures the rawness of deep suffering and the feelings of abandonment, yet within those cries exists a call to hope. Psalm 42 encourages the soul to put its hope firmly in God despite overwhelming distress.

Today, if you are wrestling with sorrow or hardship, know that your feelings are valid and God honors your honesty. But He also invites you to anchor your hope in Him, trusting that He is greater than your suffering and will bring restoration in His timing.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What emotions arise when I contemplate severe suffering or famine?
2.	How do I balance acknowledging pain with holding onto hope?
3.	Where can I turn when I feel overwhelmed by despair?







Journaling Prompts

	Write about a sorrow that felt overwhelming, and how you experienced God through it.
2.	List scriptures or truths that bring you hope during dark seasons.
3.	Reflect on ways you can support others who may be suffering deeply.







Prayer for Today

Father, my heart aches for the broken and the hungry. In moments when sorrow and despair threaten to consume me, fill me with Your hope. Help me to trust that You are working even when I cannot see it. Teach me to cry out honestly and to listen for Your comfort in that pain. May Your peace guard my heart and mind through Jesus Christ, Amen.















Your Verse

2 Kings 7:1 NIV – "Elisha replied, 'Hear the word of the Lord. This is what the Lord says: About this time tomorrow, a seah of the finest flour will sell for a shekel and two seahs of barley for a shekel at the gate of Samaria."

Supporting Scriptures

- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you... plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."
- Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him."







Devotional: Trusting God's Promises in Impossible Times

God's promises bring hope amid hopelessness. When Elisha declared that food prices would suddenly drop, it sounded impossible to those enduring famine. However, God's word is sure, and His plans always stand greater than the present reality.

Like the people in Samaria, we often face situations where hope seems irrational, but God invites us to trust His promises. Jeremiah 29:11 assures us that God holds good plans for our lives, plans full of hope and future. Romans 8:28 reminds us that He works all things for the good of those who love Him, even the painful circumstances.

Today, reflect on God's faithfulness. Are you holding onto His promises in your life? Trusting God means believing His word even when current circumstances challenge your understanding.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What promises from God do I need to hold onto today?
2.	How can I strengthen my faith when hope seems slim?
3.	What past experiences show me God's faithfulness?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a promise from God that encouraged you in hardship.
2.	Reflect on ways God has worked things out for your good.
3.	Describe areas of your life needing renewed trust in God's plan.







Prayer for Today

Lord, help me to trust Your promises fully. When circumstances look frightening or impossible, remind me that Your word never fails. Strengthen my faith to believe You even when I cannot yet see the outcome. Thank You for planning my future with hope and purpose. May I rest securely in Your loving care today. Your Verse

2 Kings 7:3-4 NIV - "Now there were four men with leprosy at the entrance of the city gate... They said to each other, 'Why stay here until we die? If we say, 'We'll go into the city'—the famine is there—and if we stay here, we will die too."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Hebrews 13:6 "So we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid."







Day 4: W Divine Intervention: Four Lepers at the Gate

Devotional: Courage to Step Into the Unknown

The four lepers faced a grim choice: remain isolated and starve or risk approaching the enemy's camp. Their courage to act despite fear led to an unexpected discovery of God's miraculous provision.

Sometimes, moving forward requires stepping beyond comfort and doubt. These men chose to trust in God's sovereignty over their lives, opting for action even when the outcome was uncertain.

Psalm 46 reminds us God is our refuge and strength, available when we face crises. Hebrews 13 encourages bold confidence in God's help. Are you willing to take a step of faith today, despite your fears? God often works through courageous actions taken in trust.

2 Kings 7:5-7 NIV - "They went to the camp of the Arameans, and when they reached the edge of the camp, no one was there... The Lord caused the Aramean army to hear the sound of chariots... They got up and ran away."

Supporting Scriptures

- Exodus 14:13 "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today."
- Psalm 77:14 "You are the God who performs miracles; you display your power among the peoples."







Day 5: XX God's Miraculous Provision Revealed

Devotional: Witnessing God's Mighty Deliverance

God's power to deliver is astonishing. The Syrian army fled in terror because God caused them to hear the noise of a vast army, though none was there. This supernatural event opened the door for provision where there was once only scarcity.

God's miracles are a reminder that obstacles we face are never beyond His reach to overcome. Just as He parted the Red Sea and delivered Israel from Egypt, He orchestrates victories in our lives today.

Exodus 14:13 encourages us to stand firm without fear and witness God's mighty deliverance. Psalm 77 declares God's miraculous works displayed among nations — including your personal battles. Praise God for His power and grace to bring provision when all seems lost.

- Matthew 6:26 "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them."







Devotional: God's Faithful Provision in Times of Need

God's provision came abundantly at the gate of Samaria just as Elisha predicted. The famine was lifted, and nourishment flowed freely to those who had been starving.

Our God is a provider who cares deeply for every need. Philippians 4:19 reminds us that God will supply all our needs from His glorious riches. Jesus' teaching about the birds invites us to trust God's care, knowing He sustains even the smallest parts of creation — including us.

Let this be an encouragement that no matter how barren your circumstances might feel, God's provision is sure and timely. Waiting on Him is never in vain, and His timing is perfect.

2.	What worries about needs can I surrender to God today?
3.	How can trusting in God's care impact my daily life?

1.	Write about a time God met a pressing need in your life.
2.	List areas where you need to trust God to provide now.
3.	Reflect on how God's provision affects your view of Him.

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:2-4 "Consider it pure joy... whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: Growing Stronger Through Trials and Trust

Reflecting on the siege of Samaria and the starving mothers reveals deep truths about faith under pressure. Despite hardship and desperation, God's people never lost the opportunity for hope and deliverance.

Trials are a refining fire producing perseverance, character, and ultimately hope. Paul's letter to the Romans highlights how suffering can deepen our spiritual maturity. James also encourages believers to find joy in trials, knowing they strengthen our faith. God's grace meets our weakness, transforming us through every challenge (2 Corinthians 12:9).

As you conclude this study, consider how your faith has grown amid struggles. Hold tightly to hope, press on with perseverance, and embrace God's transforming grace each day. Your God is faithful, and He will complete the good work He started in you.

1.	Write about ways God has used trials to grow your faith.

3.	Journal prayers asking for endurance and grace for the future.
