

Devotional: Scarlet Cord: Symbol of Divine Protection

The scarlet cord Rahab hung in her window was more than just a rope—it was a **powerful symbol of protection and redemption**. It represented the life-saving promise to Rahab and her family when the Israelites eventually conquered Jericho.

When we think of scarlet or red cords in the Bible, blood immediately comes to mind—especially the blood of the Passover lamb in Exodus. That red mark signified salvation and protection from judgment.

Similarly, Rahab's scarlet cord prefigured God's mercy and forgiveness, the threads woven through the entire story of the Bible. It reminds us that faith connects us to God's salvation and that He protects those who trust Him. Rahab's scarlet cord is a vivid reminder that redemption requires our faith in the promise God makes.

This visual sign stood out amid the destruction, showing that God sees and hears those who seek Him despite their past or surroundings.
