Faith and Doubt: Lessons from Doubting Thomas



Explore doubt, belief, and Jesus' patience through Thomas' story, deepening faith and understanding in this 7-day study on the Gospels.





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Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day journey into understanding faith and doubt through the story of Doubting Thomas. Doubt is a natural part of the human experience, even for followers of Jesus. In the Gospel of John, chapter 20 verses 24 to 29, we meet Thomas, a disciple who struggled to believe Jesus had risen from the dead without seeing the marks of the crucifixion. His story is a powerful example of how Jesus patiently meets our questions and leads us into deeper belief.

In this study, we will explore not only Thomas' doubt but also the gentle ways Jesus engages with him to nurture faith. We will learn that doubt isn't a failing; rather, it can be a stepping stone to a stronger, more authentic faith. Through daily reflections and scripture, this study will encourage you to bring your own questions and uncertainties before God and experience His grace, patience, and love. As we move through these days, consider your own moments of doubt—how have they shaped your relationship with Jesus? How can encountering His patience and truth transform your faith journey?

Each day will focus on crucial aspects of belief, doubt, and Jesus' character. We'll meditate on scripture from John's Gospel and other passages that support and enrich our understanding of this profound encounter. May this study bring encouragement and insight, inviting you to embrace your faith with renewed confidence and peace.

















Day 1: Da

Your Verse

John 20:24–25 – "Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord!' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 16:9 "When Jesus rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene."
- Luke 24:36 "While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!""







Day 1: Da

Devotional: Honest Doubt: The First Step Toward Faith

Thomas' absence on that critical day and his initial response to the disciples' testimony reveal a very human struggle: the challenge to believe without direct evidence. Thomas is sometimes unfairly labeled solely as 'Doubting Thomas,' but his desire for tangible proof reflects sincere honesty, not mere skepticism. It reminds us we can have honest questions and still be on the path of faith.

Jesus had risen, but Thomas was not there. The others were convinced, yet he hesitated. This hesitation invites us to consider: When we face claims of God's power and promises, do we rush to belief, or do we seek our own proof?

The disciples' declaration that they had seen the risen Lord sparks hope but also uncertainty in Thomas. His standard — seeing and touching the wounds — underscores how faith sometimes feels connected to real experiences, to the concrete rather than the abstract.

Today, reflect on where you stand when hearing God's promises: Do you desire signs or assurance to strengthen your belief? Jesus' patience throughout Thomas' journey sets a model for us, showing that God welcomes our questions and doubts rather than dismissing them.

Your Verse

John 20:26–27 – "A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 4:15 "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses."
- 2 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you."







Day 2: 🥎 Jesus Meets Doubt with Patience

Devotional: The Patient Heart of Jesus

Jesus' response to Thomas is neither harsh rebuke nor dismissal, but gentle invitation and patient encouragement. He meets Thomas exactly where he is, offering the proof requested but gently challenging him to move beyond doubt to faith.

This moment reflects the heart of Jesus toward us: He understands our hesitations, sees our wounds, and patiently offers peace and reassurance. His words, "Stop doubting and believe," can feel firm but are spoken with compassion, guiding Thomas from uncertainty toward trust.

Jesus' approach models how we can extend grace to ourselves and others when faith falters—patiently affirming belief while allowing space for questions.

Consider how Jesus' patience contrasts with our modern impulse for immediate answers. Faith can grow best when nurtured with time and kindness, not rushed or pressured.

Devotional: Walking by Faith, Not by Sight

Jesus' words to Thomas highlight a foundational truth: faith often requires trusting beyond visible proof. Thomas believed because he saw Jesus' wounds, but Jesus declares a blessing on those who believe without seeing.

This blessing challenges us to embrace faith that rests on trust in God's promises, even when circumstances or senses suggest otherwise. We live in a world valuing tangible proof, yet spiritual faith calls us to trust in the unseen realities of God's kingdom.

Faith does not ignore reason or evidence; rather, it chooses to rely on God's character and promises when direct evidence isn't available or clear. This kind of faith empowers believers to persevere through uncertainty, challenges, and unanswered questions.

Reflect: How can you grow in confidence in what you hope for, trusting God daily even when He seems hidden? This blessing encourages us to walk by sight—with our spirit guided by the truth of God's Word and love.

2.	How do the promises of God strengthen you when proof feels lacking?
3.	Where might you need to choose faith over doubt today?

- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."







Day 4: V Jesus' Wounds: Proof of Love

Devotional: Wounds That Speak Love

The wounds Jesus showed Thomas were not just marks of suffering; they were powerful evidence of sacrificial love. Through His pierced hands and side, Jesus demonstrated the depth of His commitment to redeem and restore humanity.

Thomas' invitation to touch the wounds is an intimate encounter with the reality of Jesus' love—painful yet victorious. The wounds remind us that Jesus' love is proven through sacrifice, vulnerability, and victorious resurrection.

When we reflect on the wounds, we see an expression of God's boundless compassion. These marks symbolize both the cost of our salvation and the assurance of Jesus' victory over death and sin.

Consider what Jesus' wounds mean for you today. Are they a source of comfort, assurance, or perhaps a call to deeper gratitude? Engaging with the reality of Jesus' sacrifice can deepen faith and ignite heartfelt worship.

Devotional: Blessed to Believe Without Seeing

Devotional: Faith Grows Best in Community

Thomas was absent when Jesus appeared, and this absence played a role in his doubt. This reveals the importance of community in nurturing faith. The disciples shared the news with Thomas, but his faith journey was still very personal, showing how each one's experience of belief and doubt is unique.

Friends and fellow believers are vital in encouraging faith, answering questions, and supporting through uncertainty. Yet, ultimately, faith is deeply personal and sometimes requires individual encounter and reflection.

Today, consider how your faith community helps or could help you in moments of doubt. Are you open to sharing your struggles? Are you willing to support others with patience and love?

Participation in a faith community offers a safe space to express doubts and grow, reminding us none of us walk alone in our spiritual journeys.
