Devotional: Setting God First in Work and Marriage

Devotional: Protecting Your Marriage Through Intentional Care

Proverbs 4:23

The "little foxes" in Song of Solomon 2:15 symbolize small issues that may seem insignificant but can ruin the marital 'vineyard' — unnoticed irritations, work bitterness, or neglect.

Love, described wonderfully in 1 Corinthians 13:4, requires attention and patience even when busy or tired. Guarding your marriage means recognizing when work pressures threaten your emotional availability and choosing to set boundaries that preserve intimacy and joy.

Ask yourself today: What 'little foxes' might be creeping in to threaten your marriage? How can you guard your heart and shield your relationship from these dangers?

- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."







Day 3: See Communication That Heals

Devotional: Using Words to Strengthen Marriage Bonds

When work pressures mount, conversations with our spouse can become strained or even hurtful. James 1:19 instructs believers to be quick to listen and slow to speak or anger. Good communication is a powerful tool for healing and connection.

Ephesians 4:29 reminds us to speak words that build others up, not tear down. Proverbs 15:1 teaches the power of gentle answers in diffusing anger.

Applying these truths means choosing to listen actively, speak kindly, and respond patiently—especially when tired or stressed. Even small daily conversations become opportunities to affirm love and understanding rather than fuel disconnect.

Consider: How might your speech either protect or damage the bond with your spouse in the context of job stress? What steps can you take toward healthier communication?
