Day 1: God's Compassion for the Mind

#### Devotional: God's Nearness to a Burdened Mind

- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."







#### Devotional: God's Power Revealed in Weakness

Ministry leaders with personality disorders may encounter moments of deep vulnerability and weakness. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians reveal a powerful truth: God's grace is enough, and His power shines brightest in our weakness. Instead of hiding our struggles, we can embrace them as places where God's strength works through us.

This doesn't minimize the difficulties of living with personality challenges, but it transforms our perspective. When we admit our need for God's grace, He uplifts us beyond our natural capabilities. His strength empowers us to lead authentically, even amid imperfection and pain.

Remember, weakness isn't disqualification for leadership—it's an invitation for God's power to move. Lean on God's grace today, knowing He equips you to continue serving effectively despite personal struggles.

Day 3: W Honest Heart Communication

#### Devotional: Healing Through Honest Relationships

Scripture stresses the importance of honest communication—for our healing, connection, and growth.

*Ephesians encourages us to live with truthfulness and authenticity.* This means opening our hearts to trusted brothers and sisters, sharing struggles without shame. James reminds us that confession and prayer together lead to healing, a vital process for mental and emotional health.

True strength in ministry comes from embracing truth with humility and trusting God's guidance. Reject isolation by seeking safe, honest relationships where you can express your inner realities in the light of God's love.
