Your Verse

Colossians 3:12 – "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 9:36 "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd."
- Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."







Devotional: Demonstrate God's Heart in Service

Compassion defines much of your service as a woman in uniform. Colossians urges us to 'clothe ourselves' with compassion, kindness, and patience—qualities that bring healing and hope to those you encounter in stressful moments.

Jesus modeled compassion perfectly; Matthew 9:36 shows how He responded to the vulnerable with a tender heart. You are called to reflect that same love in high-pressure environments where people are often hurting and afraid.

Galatians reminds us to share each other's burdens. Let compassion be the lens through which you see everyone—from victims to colleagues—bearing witness to God's love through your actions. This tender strength deeply impacts your team, community, and beyond.

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Devotional: Receive God's Peace in Stressful Times

The environments where you serve often bring chaos, urgency, and fear. Yet Jesus offers a peace unlike any the world can give—a steady calm in the storms of life.

John 14:27 reassures you that His peace replaces fear and anxiety. Philippians 4:7 expands this promise, describing how God's peace guards your heart and mind beyond human understanding. Keeping your focus on God cultivates steadfastness, resulting in perfect peace (Isaiah 26:3).

In the midst of your high-pressure shifts and unpredictable events, invite God's peace to calm your spirit and sharpen your focus. This peace empowers you to respond thoughtfully rather than react hastily, reflecting God's presence to others through your composed demeanor.

Devotional: Encouragement to Keep Going Strong
