You'll also gain practical encouragement that addresses common struggles faced when juggling these responsibilities.

Each day includes a powerful scripture passage, devotional content centered on the challenges and blessings of bivocational missions, reflective questions to deepen your connection with God's calling, guided journaling to process your journey, and a prayer to carry you forward.







As you commit to this study, remember that your labor, both in and outside the mission field, is seen and valued by God. Whether in your workplace or your ministry, your faithfulness impacts eternity.

Ask God daily to illuminate your steps and shape your decisions so that both your secular work and Gospel ministry reflect His glory.
