#### Devotional: Servant Leadership Reflecting Christ

In a culture that often prizes authority and prestige, the Bible calls leaders to a different standard: humility and servanthood. Jesus modeled this perfectly, choosing to serve rather than be served. This emulates Christ's love and invites others into a community marked by grace and unity.

Such communication fosters respect and understanding, paving the way for collaborative problem-solving and meaningful relationships. It is a powerful witness that leadership rooted in faith is not about winning arguments but about building community.
