We see this modeled perfectly in Jesus Christ — strong yet gentle, authoritative yet compassionate.

Throughout these 21 days, you will explore biblical examples of men who demonstrated faithful leadership, courage, and integrity in a variety of roles and challenges. You'll reflect on God's design for masculinity that aligns with His kingdom purposes, including traits like courage, responsibility, protection, mentoring, and servant leadership.

Our goal is to strengthen your faith and identity in Christ as a man, encouraging you to express masculine faith in a way that builds up the church body, honors women as coheirs of grace, and reflects God's heart in today's







culture. Whether you lead in your family, workplace, church, or community, you'll find practical guidance for walking in authentic, godly manhood.

As you engage daily, take time to pray earnestly, journal your thoughts, and ask the Holy Spirit for wisdom and strength. Masculine faithfulness is a daily commitment, and God welcomes you to walk confidently and humbly with Him on this journey. Let's begin our exploration of faithful masculinity that honors God and blesses those around us.

Responsibility means more than financial provision; it includes emotional, spiritual, and physical care. As you reflect on your role, ask how faithfully you fulfill these duties. Are there areas you have avoided or neglected? God calls us to work wholeheartedly and keep vigilant watch over those He has placed in our care.
