Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 13:3-9 "A farmer went out to sow... some seed fell on good soil and produced grain."
- Mark 4:14 "The sower sows the word."







Devotional: Understanding the Meaning Behind the Seeds

The parable of the sower reminds us of the diversity of hearts ready to receive God's word. Jesus uses the imagery of a farmer sowing seeds to teach us that not every heart reacts the same way to truth. Some seeds fall on paths where they are quickly taken away; others fall among thorns and struggles that choke growth; but some fall on good soil, bearing a fruitful harvest.

Devotional: The Reward of Steadfast Sowing
