Devotional: Faithfulness Begins with Understanding

Jesus initiates His teaching by highlighting the importance of being a "faithful and wise manager." This manager is entrusted with caring for the household in the master's absence, symbolizing how God entrusts us with responsibilities. The heart of the parable is about *faithfulness* — managing what God gives us with care, wisdom, and integrity.

Day 2: X Living with Eternal Perspective

Devotional: Anticipating God's Return Daily

What does it mean to live day by day with God's return in mind? It means pursuing holiness, loving others, and stewarding well what we've been given. It means aligning our hearts and actions to God's kingdom values rather than worldly distractions.

Faithfulness flows naturally from knowing that all will be revealed and rewarded. We are not living isolated moments but stepping stones to eternity. That awareness invites peaceful confidence and urgent motivation to manage life wisely.

Devotional: Choosing Wisdom in Our Responsibilities

The parable contrasts the wise steward with the unwise one who assumes the master's delay means freedom to act selfishly or lazily. This attitude reveals what happens when we lack wisdom regarding our role and responsibilities.

Wisdom for stewardship means anticipating the master's return and managing resources accordingly—not granting ourselves permission to drift or misuse what we've been given. God calls us to discernment, integrity, and foresight in our daily walk.

Proverbs and James continually stress the value of wisdom and the importance of seeking it from God. This wisdom guards us from complacency and leads to fruitful, righteous living.

Are we asking God for wisdom in how we manage our time, talents, and treasures? Are we honest about areas needing change? God promises to provide wisdom liberally when we seek it sincerely.

Devotional: Living Fully Accountable to God

God's omniscience assures us that our actions are never hidden or unnoticed. This truth can be motivating and comforting, reminding us that our labor is not in vain and that God honors faithfulness.
