Day 1: **B** Trusting God's Provision

Your Verse

Philippians 4:19 – "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 6:31–32 "So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?'... your heavenly Father knows that you need them."
- Psalm 34:10 "The lions may grow weak and hungry, but those who seek the Lord lack no good thing."







Day 1: **B** Trusting God's Provision

Devotional: God meets all your needs faithfully

Have you felt anxious about money today? It's common to worry about how bills will be paid or how to stretch a tight budget. Yet Paul encourages us in *Philippians 4:19* with a powerful promise: **God will supply all your needs**. This assurance comes from His limitless riches and glory in Jesus Christ, reminding us He has abundant resources.

Jesus also gently instructs us in *Matthew 6* not to be consumed by fear over daily provisions because our Heavenly Father is intimately aware of our needs. Trusting God means releasing the burden of control, believing that He holds our present and future securely.

Psalm 34 echoes this by contrasting the hunger of wild lions with the full satisfaction of those who seek the Lord. Seeking God first means we lack no good thing—His provision transcends mere finances to encompass peace, wisdom, and grace.

Today, examine your fears about finances. Lay them before God. Invitation: Let faith replace anxiety, knowing your provider is always close and capable.

Your Verse

Proverbs 3:9-10 - "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God... and it will be given to you."
- Luke 14:28 "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower... first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money."







Day 2: Wisdom in Financial Decisions

Devotional: Seeking God's wisdom in managing resources

Financial struggles can feel overwhelming, but God offers wisdom freely. In *Proverbs 3:9–10*, we see the beautiful principle of honoring God with what we have, starting with the firstfruits. This means giving priority to God—whether through tithing, generosity, or time—and trusting His promise of provision in return.

The book of James encourages us to ask God for wisdom, especially in making difficult decisions. When faced with budgeting or financial choices, prayerfully seek His guidance. Don't hesitate to ask for clarity and direction because God delights in giving wisdom liberally.

Jesus' teaching in *Luke 14* about counting the cost before building reminds us to plan carefully and be good stewards of what we have. Budgeting is not restrictive but empowering when grounded in God's wisdom.

Today, reflect on your financial decisions and consider how you can invite God's wisdom to lead you. Trust that He is faithful to guide every step.

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."







Day 3:
Courage in Times of Scarcity

Devotional: God's grace sustains you in weakness

Financial strain can leave us feeling weak and vulnerable. Paul's words in *2 Corinthians 12:9* remind us that God's grace is enough—especially when we feel incapable. Our weaknesses create space for His power to shine.

Fear often accompanies financial scarcity, but God calls us not to be afraid. *Isaiah 41:10* offers a powerful promise: God is always with us, providing strength when we feel weak and hope when we feel discouraged.

Psalm 46:1 assures us that God is our refuge and strength—a steady, reliable help when life feels overwhelming. Leaning into His presence during tough times doesn't erase struggles but gives courage to face them.

Today, embrace God's grace—not as a passive feeling but as active strength. Courage arises when faith and dependence on God deepen, even amid scarcity.

Devotional: Faith expressed through generous giving

It might seem counterintuitive to give when resources are scarce, yet Scripture consistently calls us to generosity. In *Luke 6:38*, Jesus teaches that giving leads to receiving—in unexpected and abundant ways. Generosity is not about the amount but the heart behind it.

Paul reminds us in *2 Corinthians 9:7* that God cherishes a cheerful giver, someone who gives willingly and joyfully. Giving isn't burdensome when faith trusts that God will provide.

Furthermore, *Acts 20:35* shares a timeless truth: there is blessing in giving, often surpassing the blessing we receive. Generosity opens our hearts to God's work and invites His provision in surprising ways.

Today, consider how you might give—even in small ways—as an outward expression of trust in God's faithfulness. Reflect on how generosity can deepen your faith and joy.

Day 5: ① Overcoming Fear in Money Matters

Devotional: Replacing fear with faith in God's protection

Financial fears can feel like weapons crafted to defeat us. Yet God's Word declares in *Isaiah 54:17* that no weapon formed against His servants will succeed. This promise reminds us that God is our defender, especially against the fears that paralyze us.

Paul reinforces this in *Romans 8:31*, highlighting that with God on our side, no adversary or challenge can ultimately harm us. Fear loses its grip when faith stands firm.

Psalm 56:3 shares a practical response—when afraid, trust God. Trust is an action, a daily choice to lean into God's protection and peace instead of fear.

Today, identify areas where fear dominates your financial outlook. Invite God's protective presence to calm your heart and empower faith over fear.
