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Introduction

Friendships ... they bring joy, support, and shared memories. Yet, sometimes, even the closest friends may drift away or the relationships we treasure seem to fade. Such experiences can be deeply painful and confusing. *How do we respond when friends walk away?* This seven-day study invites you to anchor your heart in God's unwavering faithfulness during times of relational loss.

Throughout Scripture, God demonstrates steadfast love and a faithful presence regardless of human failures and departures. From the promises echoing through the Psalms to the examples of women in the Bible who faced abandonment yet clung to God's grace, you will discover both encouragement and guidance.

Each day offers a focused Scripture passage, complemented by devotional insights that explore biblical women's responses to hardship and loss, paired with practical reflections and prayer. This plan encourages you to lean into God's love, finding healing in His constant companionship and to discover new ways to respond with grace and hope when friendships fade.

Let's journey together to grow in faith, draw strength from God's promises, and learn how to navigate the painful reality of lost friendships, becoming women rooted in God's unshakeable faithfulness.















Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."

Devotional: God Near When Your Heart Is Broken

When a friend turns away, it can feel like the ground beneath you has shifted. **Loneliness and heartbreak** often follow, but Scripture reminds us that God draws near to those who hurt. *Psalm 34:18* is a profound reassurance: God is especially close to the brokenhearted.

It's natural to want to question and hurt over fading friendships, but God's presence is a comfort that never fails. He does not abandon us even when people do. This day invites you to lean on the truth that you are never truly alone, even when relationships falter.

Ask God to reveal His closeness to you in your pain, allowing His peace to calm your spirit. Trust in His enduring love as you take the first step toward healing from relational loss.

	How does knowing God is close to your broken heart change your perspective on lost friendships?
	In what ways do you try to cope alone, and how might inviting God in bring deeper comfort?
3.	What feelings come up when you imagine God's presence in your loneliness?







Journaling Prompts

Write about a time when a friend walked away and how it affected you emotionally.
Describe what it means to you that God is close when you are brokenhearted.
List ways you can remind yourself of God's presence during difficult moments.







Prayer for Today

Dear God, thank You for drawing near when my heart is broken. I am hurting from lost friendships, but I choose to trust Your loving presence. Help me feel Your peace even when I'm lonely. *Surround me with Your comfort and hold me close.* Teach me to rely on You fully during these times. Thank You for never leaving or forsaking me. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Devotional: Protecting Your Heart Amid Friendship Pain

When friendships end or drift away, it's easy to let bitterness or hurt control our hearts. **Proverbs 4:23** teaches the importance of guarding our hearts carefully because what fills our hearts directs our lives.

God calls us to be wise and discerning in relationships, protecting our inner being even when others disappoint. This wisdom allows us to heal without bitterness and trust God's perfect plan for our future, as described in *Jeremiah* 29:11.

Today, pray for God to give you wisdom to guard your heart. Reflect on Christ's example of innocence and shrewdness — how can you respond with grace without losing your peace? Guarding your heart doesn't mean shutting down; it means holding on to God's truth.

	In what ways can guarding your heart help you remain hopeful about future friendships?







Journaling Prompts

Write about how your heart reacts when a friend walks away.
List practical ways to guard your heart without building walls.
Reflect on the balance between innocence and shrewdness in your friendships.







Prayer for Today

Father, teach me how to guard my heart well. Help me to hold Your truth close amid friendship losses. Give me wisdom to respond with grace and joy, and protect my spirit from bitterness. I trust Your plans for hope and a bright future. *Guide my thoughts and feelings today.* In Jesus' name, Amen.

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: Rooted in God's Unchanging Love

Friendships can fade, but God's love remains unshakable. **Romans 8:38–39** powerfully assures us that nothing—not pain, rejection, or loss—can separate us from God's love.

God's mercies are renewed every day, filling us with hope and healing, as the prophet Jeremiah reminds us in *Lamentations 3:22–23*. Jesus' ultimate love, laying down His life for us, models the greatest kind of friendship, one that never abandons or disappoints.

Today, fix your heart on this unfailing love. Let God's enduring affection fill the void left by departing friends, and root your identity in His constant embrace.

	What new habits can you create to remind yourself daily of God's faithfulness?

3.	Describe feelings you want to surrender to God's love this week.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for Your unfailing love that surrounds and sustains me. Even when friends leave, Your love never fails. Help me to rest in Your faithful embrace, confident that nothing can separate me from You. Remind me daily of Your mercy and grace. *Fill my heart with Your peace today.* In Jesus' precious name, Amen.

Day 4: 💋 Finding Strength in God Alone

Devotional: God, Your Refuge and Strength

When friendships fall away, you may feel vulnerable or weak. **Psalm 46:1** powerfully declares that God is our refuge and strength — a reliable help amid every trouble.

In the story of Ruth, a woman who lost much yet found strength by relying on God's provision, we see how God renews our strength when we place hope in Him (*Isaiah 40:31*). Paul echoes this by confirming that Christ empowers us to endure all hardships.

Today, turn your weakness into strength by hiding in God's refuge. Seek His help actively and trust that He will renew your energy and hope to face relational losses with courage.

Devotional: Inspired by Women Who Trusted God

The Bible features courageous women who faced loss, rejection, and loneliness yet responded with faith and resilience. **Esther** stepped into danger for a greater purpose, trusting God's timing and call.

Hannah endured years of longing and isolation before God answered her prayers. *Mary Magdalene* went from being ostracized to being the first to proclaim Jesus' resurrection.

These stories remind us that the pain of lost friendships does not define us. Instead, God can use these moments to shape us for His good plans. Today, reflect on how you might be positioned for "such a time as this" to grow stronger and deepen your faith.

2.	How can you embrace resilience in the face of relational loss?
3.	What might God be preparing you for through this season?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time you faced disappointment but grew stronger in faith.
2.	Reflect on the qualities you admire in women of the Bible.
3.	List ways you can step into God's purpose even in pain.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for examples of women in the Bible who trusted You in hard times. Help me to be resilient and courageous like them, trusting Your perfect timing and plan. Use my pain for Your glory and purpose. Strengthen my faith today and every day. In Jesus' name, Amen.



















Day 6: 6 Hope and Healing in Christ

Your Verse

Jeremiah 29:11 – "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."
- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."







Day 6: Phope and Healing in Christ

Devotional: Restoring Hope and Mending Hearts

Loss can leave wounds that seem impossible to heal. Yet God promises hope and restoration. **Jeremiah 29:11** affirms God's good plans for you, even beyond the pain of lost friendships.

Paul's words in *2 Corinthians 12:9* remind us that God's grace is enough to uphold us, making us strong in our weakest moments. *Psalm 147:3* encourages us with God's tender care for the brokenhearted.

Today, invite God to heal your wounds and restore your hope. Trust that He is working beyond what you see. Healing is a process, but with God, you are never alone.

Day 7: <a>® Moving Forward with Faith and Forgiveness

Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness and New Beginnings

As you conclude this 7-day journey, it's important to embrace forgiveness—both for others and yourself. **Ephesians 4:32** challenges us to show kindness and compassion, mirroring God's forgiveness through Christ.

Holding onto hurt can hinder your healing and future relationships. The Bible exhorts us to release bitterness and grasp freedom in forgiveness. *Colossians 3:13* encourages this release, while *Hebrews 12:1* motivates us to strip away what weighs us down.

Today, pray for the strength to forgive those who walked away and the grace to forgive yourself. Step forward renewed, carrying God's peace and love into new friendships and seasons.

Gracious God, thank You for forgiving me through Jesus. Help me to extend that forgiveness to those who have hurt or walked away from me. Remove bitterness from my heart and fill me with kindness and compassion. Move me forward in faith, hope, and love. In Jesus' name, Amen.









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
