#### Devotional: Choosing Encouragement Over Gossip

Yet, God's Word clearly instructs us to control our speech and choose words that uplift rather than destroy. **Ephesians 4:29** reminds us that our conversations should serve to benefit others and promote unity.

Gossip divides and wounds relationships, often creating ripple effects that damage teamwork and trust. When tempted to engage in casual conversations that could lead to gossip, remember the impact your words can have. Instead, focus on speaking encouraging truths, honoring your coworkers, and protecting their reputations.

By guarding your tongue, you demonstrate integrity and reverence for God, who desires full harmony among His people—even in the workplace. This day challenges you to be intentional about letting no unwholesome talk come from your mouth, thereby becoming a source of healing and peace.

#### Devotional: Walking Humbly Through Workplace Politics

#### Devotional: Humility as a Powerful Career Asset

Ambition is not wrong; God often plants desire for growth and achievement in our hearts. However, Philippians 2:3 warns against selfish ambition or conceit that can lead to strife and damage relationships.

Humility involves valuing others above ourselves and recognizing that every person is created in God's image with dignity. When we approach work with humility, we open ourselves to God's grace and favor, which often bring deeper, lasting success as James 4:6 shares.

Rather than engaging in manipulation or competition that harms others, let us foster collaboration and unity. #### Devotional: Peace-Making in the Workplace

Conflict is inevitable in any workplace, but how we respond defines our character and witness. Paul urges us in Romans 12:17-18 not to repay evil with evil, but to seek peace as far as it depends on us.

Responding with grace and patience, especially when others may act unkindly or involve us in office politics, is an act of spiritual maturity. Being a peacemaker not only prevents division but honors God and strengthens your testimony among coworkers.

James 1:19 reminds us to be quick listeners and slow to anger, enabling us to de-escalate tensions rather than inflame them. Whether dealing with gossip, unfairness, or rivalry, your choice to pursue peace reflects God's heart. Today, consider how you can be a bridge of reconciliation and maintain harmony in your work relationships.

#### Devotional: Letting Your Work Glorify God

Your career is not separated from your faith; rather, it is a stage to display God's goodness and grace. Colossians 3:17 challenges believers to do everything—work included—\*in the name of the Lord Jesus\*, dedicating each effort as an act of worship.

Letting your light shine\*through honesty, kindness, integrity, and excellence influences coworkers and honors God, even in the often challenging environment of the office.

As 1 Peter 2:12 explains, your good deeds can soften hearts and draw others toward Christ. Avoiding gossip, resisting office politics, and embracing humility aren't merely rules—they are powerful testimonies that point others to the Savior.

Conclude this study by asking God to help you continually reflect Christ in your workplace, trusting that He will use your faithful witness for His glory.
