Day 1: W God Near the Brokenhearted

Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 – "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: W God Near the Brokenhearted

Devotional: God's Nearness in Our Deepest Pain

In the face of massive loss from global disasters, grief can feel isolating. But God promises to be especially close when we are brokenhearted. - Job 1:20 "Then Job got up and tore his robe and shaved his head. He fell to the ground in worship."







Day 2: 😞 Lament: Honest Cry in Grief

Devotional: Expressing Grief Through Lament and Faith

Grief is not an experience to hide or rush through, but one to express honestly before God. The book of Lamentations models this beautifully. The prophet Jeremiah openly voices his anguish and sorrow while still clinging to God's faithfulness.

Lament is the language of a heart wrestling with pain yet refusing to abandon hope. Lamentations 3:22–23 affirms that despite feelings of despair, God's mercies and compassion remain steadfast, renewed each day. This great faithfulness offers a foundation amid the unpredictability of disaster.

Job's story further teaches us that lament can coexist with worship. Even in his deepest suffering, Job maintained reverence for God, illustrating that grief can be brought transparently to God without fear. In fact, God invites such honesty, showing that lament is a vital part of healing and trusting Him.

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast because they trust in you."
- 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 "God comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort others."







Devotional: Finding Strength and Refuge in God

Disasters often shatter the sense of security we rely on, leaving us fearful and uncertain. Yet Psalm 46 paints a vivid picture of God as our refuge and strength—a safe harbor when storms rage.

Recognizing God as 'ever-present help in trouble' invites us to stand firm amid grief because we are not alone. His strength replenishes ours, allowing us to face each day despite pain. This divine protection is a source of courage to resist fear's grip.

Isaiah reminds us that perfect peace comes from trusting God steadfastly. In turn, Paul encourages us that as God comforts us, we become vessels to comfort others facing suffering. Through this cycle, grief transforms from isolating to connecting, revealing God's faithfulness as He works through us.

1.	Describe what it means for you personally that God is your refuge.
	Write about fears that arise in grief and how you could invite God's strength.
	Reflect on how you have comforted or hope to comfort others with God's help.







Prayer for Today

Dear God, thank You for being my refuge and strength. When troubles come, help me remember You are always present and ready to help. Replace my fear with steadfast trust and perfect peace. Use the comfort You give me to support those who also grieve, so together we find hope in Your faithfulness. *Be my shelter and my courage every day.*

Romans 8:18 - "I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us."

Supporting Scriptures

- Revelation 21:4 "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain."
- 2 Corinthians 4:17 "Our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory."







Devotional: Eternal Hope Amid Present Grief

Grief from global disaster challenges hope like nothing else. However, Scripture points us beyond current suffering to the glorious future God promises.

Paul encourages believers in Romans 8:18 to view present hardships in light of eternal glory. This perspective doesn't belittle pain but reorients our focus toward God's ultimate redemption. Revelation paints an inspiring image of a new reality where tears, death, and suffering vanish forever.

Even 'light and momentary' troubles, as Paul says, serve a divine purpose that prepares us for eternal life. Holding onto this hope provides resilience and peace in grief. We grieve as those who also hope, trusting God's faithfulness transcends present loss.

	Write about what 'glory that will be revealed in us' means to you personally.
	Reflect on how focusing on eternal hope has helped or could help in your grief.
	Imagine a future free from suffering and describe what that hope feels like.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for the hope You give beyond my present suffering. Help me to keep my eyes fixed on the glory that will be revealed, trusting that You will wipe away all tears. Strengthen my heart to endure temporary grief with eternal perspective. Let Your hope fill me and overflow to encourage others who mourn. *In You, I find assurance and peace.*

Daniel 3:25 – "Look! I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 43:2 "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the fire, you will not be burned."
- Romans 8:38–39 "Nothing will separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."







Devotional: God's Presence Sustains Through Trials

Global disasters can feel like fiery trials—overwhelming, consuming, and unbearable. Yet Scripture reminds us that God's faithfulness brings protection and presence even in the most intense suffering.

The story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in Daniel 3 unveils a miraculous truth: God walks with us in the flames. The sovereign God not only saves but also sustains, ensuring we are not alone amid hardship.

Isaiah assures that passing through fiery trials will not destroy us because God is with us. Paul further emphasizes that no circumstance—no fire or flood—can separate us from God's steadfast love. This truth offers a profound reassurance during times of trauma and grief from global disasters.

Devotional: Redemption and Renewal in Grief

While grief feels like ashes strewn across our lives, God promises new life and beauty to rise from the ruins. Isaiah 61 speaks of a glorious exchange—mourning replaced by joy, ashes replaced by a crown of beauty.

This transformation doesn't minimize our pain but signifies God's redemptive power at work in even the darkest moments. Just as dawn follows the night, Psalm 30 reminds us that rejoicing comes after sorrow.

Day 7: 💙 Carrying Each Other's Burdens

Devotional: Support and Compassion in Shared Grief

In the aftermath of global disaster, grief seldom journeys alone. The Bible calls believers to come alongside one another, sharing burdens and offering encouragement.

Galatians 6:2 emphasizes that carrying each other's burdens fulfills Christ's law of love. Mourning together honors the deep pain experienced while building community where healing begins.

Romans expands this by encouraging us to both rejoice and mourn with others, reflecting empathy and solidarity. Hebrews reminds us that consistent encouragement is vital as we face trials.
