#### Devotional: God Is Your Ever-Present Refuge

In times of crisis, it can be easy to feel isolated and overwhelmed. However, Psalm 46:1 reminds us that God is not distant. Instead, He is our refuge and strength—a sanctuary where we can run to and find peace.

#### Devotional: Healing Power of God's Unbreakable Love

## Devotional: Armor Yourself with God's Strength Today
