Day 2: Doving Words in Difficult Conversations

- Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up."







Day 2: Doving Words in Difficult Conversations

#### Devotional: The Power of Gentle and Loving Speech

Words hold immense power in shaping fellowship, especially when political views clash. James instructs believers to listen carefully and control anger because impulsive speech often leads to strife rather than righteousness. Difficult conversations require intentional restraint and graciousness.

Choosing gentle words amid disagreement is not weakness but strength—it reflects a mature faith that seeks to build rather than tear down. Soft answers cool heated moments, allowing dialogue to continue without bitterness. Our speech should aim to edify others, encouraging understanding and respect despite differences.

When politics stir tension, pause before responding. Ask God to guide your tongue and soften your heart. Remember that your words can either escalate conflict or invite peace. Reflect today on how your speech impacts relationships and commit to loving expression that honors God and others.

#### Devotional: Unconditional Love Despite Differences
