Devotional: Rooted in Christ for Lasting Growth

Fellowship is also about growth—spiritual and relational growth that happens as we remain rooted in Christ together. Paul encourages believers to be deeply planted in Jesus, allowing this foundation to strengthen and build up faith.

The image of a three-strand cord in Ecclesiastes reveals how an intertwined relationship with God and friends becomes unbreakable, offering resilience through life's challenges.

Galatians reminds us to support each other by sharing burdens, which strengthens collective faith and friendship. Growth in fellowship isn't passive; it requires intentional effort—praying together, encouraging one another, and correcting in love.

Think about the ways you and your friends are growing in Christ. Are you encouraging each other's faith journey? What steps can you take to deepen this growth?
