# Fellowship in Caring for Widows

- James 1:27 "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress..."

#### Devotional: God's Compassion for Widows Revealed

**Day 1** invites us to encounter the heart of God for widows, reminding us of His compassionate nature. The Psalmist declares God as a defender and father to the fatherless and widows—a tender picture of a God who does not neglect the vulnerable.

In Scripture, God's care for widows is not passive; it is active and just. He defends their causes and provides for their needs. This divine example sets the foundation for our own fellowship—our bond in Christ ought to reflect this deep compassion.

- Exodus 22:22 "Do not take advantage of the widow or the fatherless."
- Deuteronomy 27:19 "Cursed is anyone who withholds justice from the foreigner, the fatherless or the widow."







#### Devotional: God's Clear Call to Protect and Provide

**God's Word is clear.** Caring for widows is more than kindness; it's a command. Day 2 draws us into the Scriptures to understand how God instructs His people to protect, provide for, and honor widows.

1 Timothy tells us about widows who are truly in need—those vulnerable and without support. These women place their hope in God during difficult times. The early church was charged with caring for widows as part of their fellowship, demonstrating faith through action. To neglect this responsibility was not simply ignoring a social duty; it was disobedience to God's law.

Exodus and Deuteronomy reinforce this call by prohibiting exploitation and injustice toward widows. When we choose to care for widows, we align ourselves with God's justice and mercy. This fellowship is a powerful witness of God's kingdom on earth.

Reflect on how honoring and supporting widows strengthens not only individuals but the entire faith community.

- 1 Timothy 5:9-10 "No widow may be put on the list of widows unless she is over sixty, has been faithful to her husband..."
- James 1:27 "to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world."







Day 3: 🏡 Early Church Fellowship for Widows

#### Devotional: Organized Care as Fellowship in Action

The early church recognized the importance of intentional care. On Day 3 we examine how they structured fellowship to support widows and those in need.

In Acts 6, we read about a practical solution to ensure widows were not neglected: the appointment of deacons to oversee distribution and care. This shows that fellowship involves deliberate action and organization.

Paul's letter to Timothy gives guidelines about whom the church should officially support, emphasizing faithfulness and dignity. Serving widows was part of sustaining the community and keeping the church pure and true to its calling, as James reminds us.

Reflect on how fellowship is both loving and purposeful, and how your community might learn from the early church's example in caring for those in loss.

#### Devotional: Reflecting Christ's Love Through Fellowship

**The ultimate measure of fellowship is love.** Day 5 brings us to Jesus' command to love each other as He loved us, a love that is selfless, sacrificial, and inclusive.

When we care for widows and those in loss, we not only obey God's law but manifest the presence of His kingdom here on earth. 1 John reminds us that ignoring those in need reveals a heart disconnected from God's love. In contrast, Matthew shows that serving the vulnerable is serving Christ Himself.

As you close this study, reflect on how your fellowship can be a visible sign of Christ's love—especially for widows experiencing loss. Let this love transform your community and spur unshakeable hope.
