#### Your Verse

1 John 1:7 - "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."

- Hebrews 10:24–25 "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together..."
- Acts 2:42 "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."







Day 1: Christ-Centered Fellowship

#### Devotional: Walking in Christ's Light Creates True Fellowship

Fellowship begins with walking in the light of Christ. When we allow Jesus' presence to illuminate our lives, our relationships become genuine and lifegiving. *1 John 1:7* reminds us that as we walk in His light, we experience true fellowship not only with God but with one another. This fellowship is purified and deepened by the blood of Jesus. In everyday living, seeing Christ means embracing honesty, humility, and love in our interactions.

In the early church, believers intentionally devoted themselves to fellowship alongside teaching and prayer. #### Your Verse

Romans 12:13 – "Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 Peter 4:9 "Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling."
- Acts 16:15 "She and the members of her household were baptized...and she invited us to her home."







#### Devotional: Hospitality Reveals Christ's Heart Through Us

Hospitality is a tangible expression of fellowship. Through opening our homes and hearts, we share not only physical space but also spiritual encouragement. *Romans 12:13* calls us to practice hospitality and share with those in need, reflecting Christ's generosity.

Hospitality goes beyond meals and invitations—it is about creating a welcoming environment where others feel valued and loved. 1 Peter encourages us to do this cheerfully and without complaint, highlighting the heart attitude behind our actions.

In Acts, Lydia exemplifies hospitality by welcoming Paul and his companions, leading to the baptism of her household. This shows how welcoming others can open doors for God's work. When we practice hospitality daily—in our workplaces, friendships, or neighborhoods—we live out fellowship in practical ways, allowing Christ to be seen in ordinary moments.

- Colossians 4:6 "Let your conversation be always full of grace..."







#### Devotional: Speak Words that Uplift and Heal Others

Our words carry the power to build up or break down. In everyday fellowship, using gracious and encouraging speech is vital. *Ephesians 4:29* encourages believers to speak only words that build others up and impart grace.

Proverbs beautifully describes gracious words as sweet and healing—the kind of spiritual nourishment that refreshes weary souls. When we choose our words carefully, we become channels of God's love, healing, and hope in daily encounters.

Colossians reminds us to let our conversations be seasoned with grace, showing kindness even in casual talk. Consider how your words impact the atmosphere around you. Could a kind word revive someone's spirit today? Fellowship is lived out every time we choose to encourage instead of criticize or remain silent.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- John 13:14 "Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet."
- Philippians 2:3 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."







#### Devotional: Humble Service Reflects Christ's Love Practically

**Fellowship flourishes through humble service.** Serving others isn't about earning approval but reflecting Christ's love by putting others' needs before our own. *Galatians 5:13* exhorts us to serve humbly and in love.

Jesus demonstrated this humility by washing His disciples' feet—a task reserved for the lowest servant. He calls us to the same attitude of self-emptying love, valuing others above ourselves (Philippians 2:3).

In everyday life, small acts of service—listening patiently, helping a coworker, or offering to carry a burden—become powerful testimonies of Christ at work through us. Such acts knit hearts together in fellowship and reflect the servant heart Christ calls us to embody.

#### Prayer for Today

**Lord Jesus, thank You for modeling humble service and love.** Teach me to serve selflessly and with a joyful heart. Help me to see others through Your eyes and to put their needs before mine. Strip away pride and selfishness, filling me instead with Your humility. Use my hands and heart to build up Your body, strengthening fellow believers and those around me. *In Your precious name, Amen.*

















#### Your Verse

Matthew 25:40 – "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Hebrews 13:2 "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it."
- 1 Corinthians 12:25–26 "...so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other."







#### Devotional: Recognizing Christ in Every Person Transforms Fellowship

To live fellowship well is to see Christ in every person we meet. Jesus teaches in Matthew 25 that serving "the least of these" is serving Him directly. This radical truth challenges us to recognize His presence in all people, especially those often overlooked or marginalized.

Hebrews warns us not to neglect hospitality to strangers, reminding us that we might be entertaining angels unawares. This elevates everyday encounters to sacred opportunities.

Paul's letter to the Corinthians emphasizes unity and mutual concern within the body of Christ. When we genuinely care for one another, seeing Christ reflected in us, fellowship deepens and multiplies. May today be a day you intentionally look for Christ in each person you meet, offering love and grace freely as if to the Lord Himself.
