Devotional: Overcoming Barriers to Unity in Digital Spaces

Let us strive to be peacemakers, anticipating misunderstandings, and choosing grace over harshness in our digital fellowship. Conflict might be inevitable, but how we respond fosters unity or division. God's Spirit empowers us to pursue love that binds us together despite the challenges.
