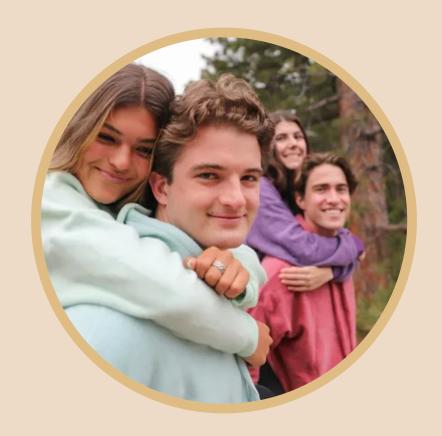

#### Devotional: Strength Found in Shared Burdens

Parenting teens can sometimes feel like walking a tightrope alone—balancing authority, love, and guidance amidst rapidly changing emotions. Ecclesiastes 4:9–10 reminds us that two are better than one because shared effort yields greater strength and safety. When one parent stumbles under discouragement or exhaustion, having someone to help lift them up is invaluable.

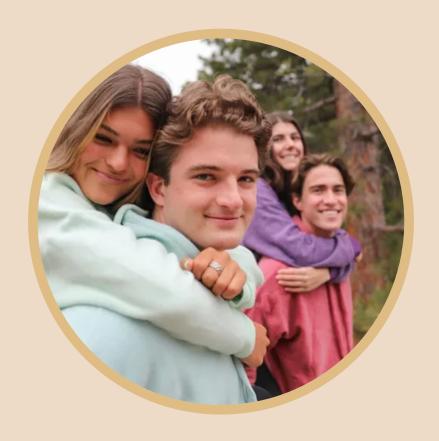
#### Prayer for Today

#### Devotional: Courage to Share Truth in Love

When we create safe spaces to be real, we foster healing and growth, both individually and collectively. Take courage today to reach out with openness, knowing God honors transparency and heals through loving fellowship.

#### Devotional: Praying Together for Wisdom and Peace

Nothing strengthens fellowship more than coming together to seek God's wisdom in prayer. Matthew 18:20 promises that when two or three gather in Jesus' name, He is present among them, which is a powerful reminder for parents facing the complexities of raising teens.

Many parenting challenges stir anxieties—uncertainties about choices, discipline, future, and emotional well-being. Philippians 4:6 encourages us to lay all these worries before God in prayer with thanksgiving, releasing our anxiety and inviting peace.

Fellowship in parenting includes praying for one another and with one another. Colossians 1:9 shows a commitment to ask God continually to fill each other with spiritual wisdom and understanding. Collective prayer deepens relationships, aligns hearts with God's will, and often reveals fresh insight for handling everyday struggles.

#### Prayer for Today

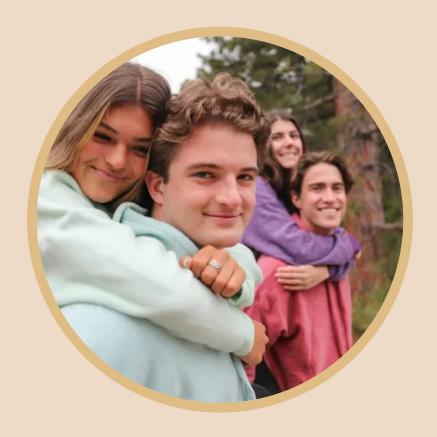

## Devotional: Building Up Each Other in Joy and Struggle

#### Prayer for Today

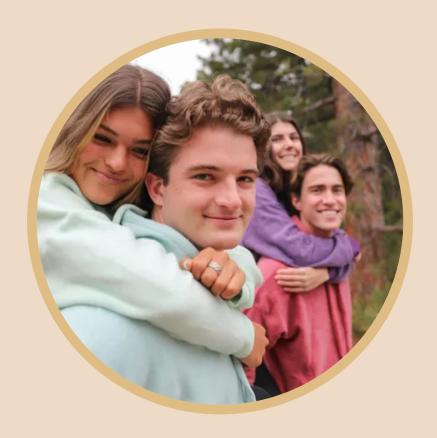
