#### Devotional: Devoted Fellowship: A Lifeline at Every Age

#### Devotional: Connected to Christ: Fruitful in Every Season

Many wonder if retirement signals the end of fruitfulness. Scripture assures us that fruit-bearing continues when we remain connected to Christ, the true Vine.

Remaining in Jesus means growing through fellowship, prayer, and service. Psalm 92 declares the righteous will still thrive and bear fruit in old age, a beautiful promise of God's sustaining power. Isaiah reminds us that God will strengthen and uphold us all our days.

Fruitfulness in retirement can take forms like mentoring younger believers, volunteering, hospitality, or simply sharing God's love daily. It flows from abiding deeply in Christ and remaining engaged with our faith community.
