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Introduction

Your Verse

Romans 12:4-5 - For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 12:27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.
- Galatians 3:28 There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

Devotional: Your Identity in Christ Unites You

Fellowship begins with recognizing our shared identity in Christ. Singleness does not define your worth or your place in God's family. Paul explains how believers form one unified body, each with unique roles but equal value. The body metaphor urges us to see beyond superficial distinctions—like marital status—and to embrace belonging based on Christ's love.

You are an integral member of God's body, called to fully participate and contribute. This truth is liberating for singles who might feel isolated or less significant. Your role is essential, and your gifts enrich the whole community. Let Him fill you with confidence that your belonging is secure.

Today, reflect on how focusing on unity in Christ can shift your view of fellowship. Seek to connect with the body of believers around you as a treasured part of God's family, not defined by what you don't have, but by who you are in Him.

Your Verse

Hebrews 10:24-25 - And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Supporting Scriptures

- Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.
- Ecclesiastes 4:9 Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor.







Devotional: Life Shared Is Faith Strengthened

Fellowship thrives when believers intentionally share life together. For singles, being part of community is not just about attendance but about mutual encouragement, accountability, and love. Hebrews urges us not to neglect meeting together but to spur one another toward faithfulness.

In singleness, you have a unique opportunity to invest deeply in relationships, to encourage, and to receive encouragement. Community strengthens us for the challenges of life and helps us to reflect Jesus' heart. The early church exemplifies this—sharing everything in fellowship and supporting one another deeply.

Reflect on how you participate in your faith community. What can you offer? How can you be spurred on and also spur others on? Sharing life together is a key part of your spiritual health and joy.

	Set a goal for one way you will engage more deeply in fellowship this week.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for the gift of community. Help me not to isolate myself but to seek out meaningful fellowship with others. Use me to encourage someone today and open my heart to receive encouragement as well. Teach me to love and support the body of Christ faithfully. May our shared journey bring glory to Your name and strengthen each of us in faith. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*















Your Verse

Psalm 68:6 - God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 7:32–35 The unmarried woman cares for the things of the Lord, that she may be holy both in body and spirit.
- John 15:15 I no longer call you servants... Instead, I have called you friends.







Devotional: God's Family Embraces the Single

God provides belonging even for the lonely and the single. Psalm 68 reminds us that God places those who feel isolated into families. His adoption into the spiritual family is a beautiful rescue from loneliness.

Singleness can be a season of deep intimacy with God and rich friendships. 1 Corinthians shows that singleness offers freedom to focus on God's work, and Jesus calls us His friends—proof of intimate belonging. Your value and inclusion don't depend on marriage but on your relationship with God and His people.

Reflect on how you experience God's family today. Are you fully resting in His provision of belonging? Consider reaching out to deepen godly friendships and embracing the family God has given.

	What might it look like to embrace belonging in God's family without relying on marital status?
3.	How can you cultivate friendships that reflect God's love and acceptance?

1.	Write about moments when you felt closest to God as your Father or friend.
2.	List ways God has provided spiritual family around you.
3.	Journal your thoughts on embracing singleness as a gift and calling.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, thank You for setting me in Your family to belong and be cherished. Help me to experience Your love so deeply that I am free from loneliness or comparison. Teach me to cherish the friendships and community You've placed around me. Let me grow in intimacy with You as my closest friend and Father. I surrender my longing for belonging into Your capable hands. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Your Verse

1 Peter 4:10 - Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 4:16 From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.
- Colossians 3:23–24 Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord.







Day 4: K Serving Together in God's Family

Devotional: Serving Builds Connection and Fellowship

Fellowship involves active service in the body of Christ. Your singleness allows you unique flexibility and time to serve God's family wholeheartedly. Peter encourages believers to steward their gifts faithfully for the benefit of others.

Serving is not about status but about love in action. When each member uses their gifts, the whole church strengthens and grows. Singleness is a season ripe for pouring out your time and talents, bringing blessing and unity.

Today, consider how God has gifted you and how you might engage more fully in serving your spiritual family. Serving builds connection and reveals God's love tangibly, deepening your fellowship.

Your Verse

John 13:34–35 – A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 John 4:7–8 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.
- Romans 15:5-6 May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.







Devotional: Love: The Heartbeat of Fellowship

The foundation of fellowship is love modeled on Christ's example. Jesus commands us to love one another, and this love testifies to the world our identity as His disciples. Singleness or any status is secondary to living out genuine, sacrificial love within God's family.

Love creates unity, encouragement, and belonging. When we exhibit this love, the church shines as a beacon of hope and authenticity, drawing others to Christ. Your singleness gifts you with freedom to express this love in varied and impactful ways.

Today is an invitation to live as one loving family, reflecting Jesus' heart fully through intentional love, patience, and encouragement. Your fellowship rooted in love is invaluable and transforming.

2.	List practical ways you can show Christ-like love in your community.
	Journal a commitment to love intentionally despite challenges or loneliness.
