Day 2: Sharing Lives and Possessions

Devotional: Generosity: The Language of Fellowship

The early church displayed radical generosity—sharing not just time and worship but material possessions. In **Acts 2:44–45**, believers embraced a lifestyle where no one lacked because others gave freely to meet needs. This tangible act of love expressed the spiritual unity and compassion that defined their community.

Paul reminds us in *2 Corinthians 8* that sharing is about creating balance, reflecting God's justice and mercy. *1 John 3* challenges us to see the connection between love for God and practical care for others.

Devotional: Prayer: The Lifeblood of Community
