# Devotional: Hospitality Begins with a Heart Open to Others

Hospitality begins with the heart. Romans 12:13 calls us not only to help those in need but specifically to practice hospitality. This means intentionally welcoming others into our lives—whether into our homes, our conversations, or our hearts. Hospitality is a spiritual discipline, an outward expression of God's love through tangible action.

# Devotional: Following Jesus' Example: Welcoming and Serving Others

Jesus as a host sets the ultimate example. Notice how He intentionally chose to enter Zacchaeus' home, a man often rejected and despised by society. Jesus sought out the outsider, extending welcome and acceptance, sparking transformation and restoration.

In Mark, we see Jesus dining with tax collectors and sinners, breaking social norms and emphasizing that fellowship through hospitality crosses barriers. His table was a place where brokenness met grace and new life sprang forth.

Additionally, Jesus' act of washing His disciples' feet (John 13) is a profound gesture of humble service within fellowship. Hospitality is not just about inviting others in but also serving them with love and humility.

We are called to follow Jesus' lead—not merely providing for physical needs but creating an environment where people feel truly valued and loved.

#### Your Verse

# Devotional: Sharing Meals: A Pathway to Unity and Grace

Breaking bread is a sacred act of fellowship. In the early church described in Acts, believers gathered daily—not just in public spaces but in homes, sharing meals with joy and sincerity. This simple act fostered deep community and spiritual connection.

Paul reminds us that the bread we break symbolizes our unity with Christ and one another. Jesus' own practice of breaking bread, especially after His resurrection, reveals how such moments can revive hope and strengthen faith.

Hospitality rooted in sharing meals transcends cultural and social divides. It allows for vulnerability, storytelling, and mutual encouragement. When we welcome others to our table, we invite them into God's family and into shared grace.

Consider how you might intentionally break bread in your circles to cultivate fellowship that reflects Christ's body.

- Proverbs 19:17 "Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will reward them for what they have done."
- Luke 14:12–14 "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends... But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind."







#### Devotional: Receiving Spiritual Blessings Through Hospitality

Welcoming others brings blessings both seen and unseen. Jesus teaches that when we feed the hungry, quench the thirsty, and welcome the stranger, we are serving Him directly. Hospitality is a tangible way of living out our faith, aligning our actions with God's heart for mercy and kindness.

Proverbs reminds us that kindness shown to the poor is ultimately a lending to the Lord, promising rewards beyond this life. Luke challenges us to reach beyond our comfort zones when we host, inviting those who cannot repay us, reflecting God's unconditional love.

Opening our lives and resources can be risky and require intentionality, but the spiritual harvest is abundant. Hospitality transforms not only those we welcome but also us, growing patience, compassion, and faith.

Reflect on the blessings God offers when we mirror His hospitality and welcome others with open arms.

- Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."







#### Devotional: Embracing Fellowship as a Lifelong Journey

Hospitality and fellowship are ongoing callings, not occasional acts. Walking in the light means living transparently and lovingly with one another, creating authentic community. This requires intentional cultivation of virtues such as compassion, kindness, humility, and patience, which bind us together in unity.

Paul urges believers to wear these qualities daily and to bear each other's burdens, reflecting the law of Christ. Fellowship becomes a lifestyle that permeates all relationships, sustained by love.

When hospitality is seen as a continuous way of living, it transforms homes, churches, and communities. It invites everyone to belong and contributes to spiritual health and growth. This is the fellowship Jesus envisioned—one marked by openness, generosity, and deep connection.

As you conclude this study, ask God how He wants to deepen your walk of fellowship and hospitality going forward.
