#### Devotional: Make Every Tradition Glorify Christ

Holidays and traditions become transformational when we celebrate with *purpose*. Colossians 3:17 reminds us to do everything—including our celebrations—in the name of Jesus. This means thanking God and glorifying Him with both word and deed.

Often, celebrations can become distracted by commercialism, busyness, or expectations. But God calls us to refocus on His presence in every moment. Whether sharing a meal, exchanging gifts, or worshiping corporately, each act has spiritual significance when done for God's glory.

Think about the traditions you observe. How can they serve as reminders of God's goodness and faithfulness? Embedding Scripture readings, prayers, or worship during holidays can center the atmosphere on Christ. This intentionality invites God Himself into family customs and fosters unity around divine truths.

Celebrating with Christ at the center transforms traditions from mere routines into holy encounters full of gratitude and joy.

- Acts 2:46 "Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts."

#### Devotional: Breaking Bread Builds Spiritual Bonds

Shared meals have always been a key way God's people experience fellowship. In Luke 24, Jesus is recognized by His disciples as He breaks bread with them—a sacred moment linking nourishment with revelation.
