Devotional: The Power of Shared Purpose

- Romans 12:10 "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves."







Day 3: **B** Serving in Humility

Devotional: Serving One Another with Humility

True fellowship is rooted in humility. Philippians 2:3 reminds us to set aside selfish ambition and esteem others above ourselves. In shared work projects, pride can sometimes cause friction, but Christ's example calls us to serve with a humble heart.

Jesus Himself came not to be served but to serve (Mark 10:45), modeling the servant-leader mindset we are called to embody. When working with others, being willing to take on even the less glamorous tasks, listening attentively, and putting the group's needs before our own facilitates healthy, loving fellowship.

Romans 12 exhorts us to be devoted and honor one another. This attitude leads to mutual respect and strengthens collaboration. When humility guides our teamwork, we create an environment where excellence flourishes naturally because every person's contribution is valued.

- Nehemiah 2:18 "Let us rise up and build." Then they strengthened their hands for the good work.







Devotional: Co-Workers Building God's Kingdom

Shared work projects remind us that we are co-builders in God's kingdom.

Paul writes in 1 Corinthians that we labor together for God's service, constructing a spiritual edifice as a unified body. Each individual's effort contributes to the overall strength and beauty of the work.

Ephesians 4 expands on this, emphasizing how every part must join and support one another to grow together in love. Working alongside others in shared projects is a tangible expression of this unity, where strengths complement weaknesses, and encouragement flows freely.

Nehemiah's call to rise and build is a powerful example. After assessing the challenge, the people united their hands and hearts for the task, embodying the spirit of fellowship through collective effort. When you participate in shared work, remember you are part of something bigger—a living, growing testimony for God's glory.

Devotional: Serving Gracefully for God's Glory

The ultimate goal of fellowship and shared work is to glorify God. 1 Peter 4 calls us to use our gifts faithfully as stewards of God's grace. When believers unite their diverse talents in service, the result is a powerful testimony of God's presence and power.

Jesus encourages us in Matthew 5 to let our light shine through good deeds, drawing others to glorify the Father. Working together with excellence and humility radiates God's love and attracts people to the gospel.

Romans 15 reminds us that endurance, encouragement, and unity enable us to glorify God with one voice. When fellowship is grounded in mutual respect, love, and shared mission, we effectively reflect God's glory to a watching world. As you conclude this study, commit to partnering with excellence for God's glory in every project you undertake.
