Sharing vulnerabilities through journaling can be a powerful tool for fighting fair. **Psalm 51:6** highlights God's desire for a broken and contrite heart more than formal sacrifices, inviting honesty and humility before Him and others.

James teaches us that confessing to one another brings healing. When couples share journal entries, they can safely express feelings, uncover hidden emotions, and gain insights about each other.

Proverbs reminds us that the heart's intentions are deep, but insight can bring these to light. Journals provide a non-threatening space to explore and share those depths thoughtfully.

Today, engage in sharing written reflections with your spouse. Listen with open hearts and pray together, embracing this practice as a step toward deeper connection and healthier conflict navigation.

Colossians urges conversations to be full of grace and seasoned with wisdom, creating dialogue that builds rather than breaks down.

Today, focus on using respectful speech during conflict. Notice if words unintentionally offend and actively replace criticism with kindness, striving to honor Christ in your communication with your spouse.
