Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- - Isaiah 41:10: "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- - Psalm 147:3: "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."







Devotional: God's Closeness to the Brokenhearted

We all experience times when our hearts feel shattered, and our spirits crushed. On those days, it's easy to feel utterly alone. But Psalm 34:18 assures us of a divine truth: *God is close to the brokenhearted.* This means that in your pain and suffering, God doesn't keep His distance. Rather, He draws near. Your Verse

Psalm 34:1 - "I will extol the Lord at all times; his praise will always be on my lips."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 13:15: "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise."
- - Philippians 4:6: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."







Day 2: 😂 The Power of Praising God in Hardship

Devotional: Praise as a Path Through Pain

Praise is often reserved for joyful moments, but Psalm 34:1 challenges us to praise God *at all times*, including in suffering. Praising God during hard times is a radical act of faith—it declares that despite pain, God's goodness and power are unshaken.

Praise reshapes our perspective by focusing our hearts on God's character rather than our circumstances. Hebrews 13:15 calls us to continually offer praise as a spiritual sacrifice, reminding us that worship is a weapon against despair.

Philippians 4:6 urges us to present anxieties to God with thanksgiving, which helps release fear and invites peace. When we choose praise, even when it feels difficult, we trust that God is working behind the scenes for our good.

Today, try praising God aloud or silently, even if your heart feels heavy. Let praise unlock hope and strength within you.

Day 3: **(**) Trusting God's Deliverance from Fear

Devotional: Walking Out of Fear in Faith

Devotional: Restoration Amidst Trials

Devotional: Radiance from God's Deliverance

Looking to God amid suffering brings a remarkable transformation: radiance and joy. Psalm 34:5 tells us that those who fix their eyes on the Lord shine with a brightness that overcomes shame and despair.

- - Proverbs 3:5-6: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding."







Devotional: A Blessed Life of Trust and Testimony
