Day 1:  God's Presence in Grief

Devotional: God Draws Near to the Brokenhearted

Day 2:  Hope Beyond the Pain

Devotional: Embracing Eternal Hope in Suffering

Grief often feels unbearable because it focuses our attention on what has been lost. Yet Scripture encourages us to look beyond the immediate pain to the eternal hope that God promises.

Romans 8:18 reminds believers that present sufferings, no matter how severe, are temporary compared to the everlasting glory awaiting us. For earthquake survivors, this doesn't negate their trauma but points them to a future restoration where pain and tears will be no more.

Revelation 21:4 offers a beautiful promise: God Himself will wipe away every tear. Imagine the comfort such a hope instills in hearts shattered by loss and upheaval.

As you pray today, intercede for the survivors to hold on to hope. Ask God to gently lift their eyes to the future glory and peace He has prepared — a hope that sustains even amid ongoing hardship.

Today, prize trusting God through uncertainty. Pray for earthquake survivors and yourself to rest in God's perfect plan and timing despite hardship.

Pray today for restoration in the lives of earthquake survivors—physical rebuilding, emotional healing, and spiritual renewal. Trust that God is faithful to bring new beginnings from the wreckage.
