Through prayers, reflections, and journaling, this study encourages heartfelt engagement that leads to growth and healing. Whether you are helping a loved one who is nearing the end of life or facing grief yourself, may these days bring clarity, peace, and a renewed sense of God's presence in every step of the journey.

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Ecclesiastes 3:1 "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."







Devotional: Acknowledging Grief opens the journey of healing

Grief is real and inevitable. When a loved one nears the end of life, emotions surge—fear, sorrow, guilt, and regret may flood the heart. It's important to face grief honestly instead of burying feelings or pretending all is well. Scripture reminds us that God is close to the brokenhearted and understands our pain deeply.

Psalm 34:18 offers profound comfort: God draws near specifically to those crushed by grief. This nearness invites us to bring every hurt to Him. Whether guilt from unspoken words or choices made—or not made—God welcomes it all. He does not condemn but saves and heals.

Taking time to acknowledge grief also honors the value of our relationships. **Ecclesiastes 3:1** encourages us that there is a season for every aspect of life, including mourning. In recognizing our grief openly, we begin to surrender hurt and make space for healing.

1.	What feelings am I avoiding about the approaching loss or grief?
2.	How does knowing God is near to the brokenhearted comfort me today?
	What might it look like to welcome God into my pain instead of pushing it away?







Journaling Prompts

Write about a specific regret or guilt you feel regarding your loved one.
Describe how you currently handle your emotions in grief.
Record a prayer asking God to meet you in your brokenness.







Prayer for Today

Dear Lord, You are close to my broken heart today. Help me to be honest about my feelings and bring them into Your loving presence. Heal the wounds that grief and guilt have left, and remind me that I am not alone in this journey. Give me strength to face difficult emotions and resting peace when they overwhelm me. *Thank You for Your unfailing love and comfort.* In Jesus' name, Amen.

















Day 2: V Understanding Guilt's Grip

Your Verse

1 John 1:9 - "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 103:12 "As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us."
- Romans 8:1 "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."







Day 2: V Understanding Guilt's Grip

Devotional: God's forgiveness frees us from guilt

Guilt often accompanies grief, especially as death approaches. We may replay moments, wishing we'd done things differently or fearing our loved one feels regret. However, God's Word teaches that guilt does not have to dominate our hearts or theirs.

1 John 1:9 promises that when we confess sins and regrets to God, He is faithful to forgive and purify us completely. This foreshadows the freedom we find in Christ, who carries away our burdens and removes condemnation.

Psalm 103:12 beautifully illustrates this removal — God casts our mistakes as far from us as east is from west. This radical forgiveness is available not only in the moment but also before death. *Releasing guilt allows space for peace to grow.*

Romans 8:1 seals this truth: no condemnation exists for believers. Let these truths comfort both those nearing loss and those grieving. Guilt may come, but it need not stay.

Day 2: V Understanding Guilt's Grip

Prayer for Today

Merciful Father, I bring before You all the guilt and regrets that weigh on my heart. Thank You for Your faithfulness to forgive and purify me when I confess my sins. Help me release condemnation so I can experience true peace. May Your grace soften the hearts of my loved ones and me as we face difficult emotions together. In Jesus' name, Amen.

















Your Verse

Ephesians 2:8-9 - "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."
- Titus 3:5 "He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy."







Devotional: Grace empowers us beyond guilt and weakness

Grace is the unearned gift that God offers, especially in times when we feel least deserving. When guilt tries to hold us captive, it is the perfect moment to reach towards God's grace—understanding that our healing is not based on our actions but His mercy.

Ephesians 2:8-9 reminds us that salvation and peace come freely by faith, not by deeds. This truth can help release feelings of needing to "fix" everything or make amends perfectly as death approaches.

Paul's words in **2 Corinthians 12:9** offer encouragement that God's grace is sufficient, especially in weakness. When regret overwhelms, God's power fills the gap, bringing restoration and hope. *Releasing guilt invites us into a deeper experience of grace.*

Similarly, **Titus 3:5** underlines God's mercy as the foundation of our salvation—an anchor for both the living and those preparing to meet the Lord.







Reflect and Apply

1.	How can I rest more fully in God's grace rather than my own efforts?
2.	In what ways does embracing grace relieve the weight of guilt and regret?
3.	What does God's grace offer to my loved one during this season of life?







Journaling Prompts

Write about a time when God's grace surprised you in your weakness.
Describe what releasing guilt through grace might look like practically.
Pray for the strength to accept grace fully today.







Prayer for Today

Gracious God, thank You that Your grace is more than enough for me and my loved ones. Teach us to rest in Your mercy and release the burden of guilt. May Your power be made perfect in our weakness and bring peace where there has been pain. Help us trust Your gift of salvation and love today. In Jesus' name, Amen. **

















Your Verse

Romans 15:13 – "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:1–3 "Do not let your hearts be troubled...I go to prepare a place for you."
- 1 Thessalonians 4:13–14 "We do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death...we believe Jesus died and rose again."







Devotional: Hope anchors our soul beyond grief

Hope is the anchor that steadies us during storms of grief. When facing death and the emotions around it, Scripture assures us that God is a God of hope, ready to fill our hearts with peace and joy beyond circumstances.

Romans 15:13 powerfully declares that trusting God allows the Holy Spirit to overflow us with hope, enabling us to endure difficult days with courage.

The comforting words of Jesus in **John 14:1–3** remind us He prepares a place beyond this life—a promise that shatters the finality of death and invites us to anticipate reunion. *This hope is not wishful thinking but grounded in the resurrection of Christ.* As Paul encourages in **1 Thessalonians 4:13–14**, believers grieve with hope, knowing death is not the end.

Allow this hope to penetrate your heart today, releasing fear and guilt with the confidence of God's eternal promises.







Reflect and Apply

1.	How does the hope of eternal life shape my view of grief and loss?
2.	What fears or doubts can I surrender to God's promise of peace today?
3.	How might I encourage a loved one with this hope as death approaches?







Journaling Prompts

Write about what hope means in the context of grief for you personally.
Recall a Bible promise that brings you peace and why it matters.
Pray asking God to fill you with hope and pour it into your loved one.







Prayer for Today

God of all hope, fill our hearts with joy and peace as we trust You during this difficult season. When grief threatens to overtake us, remind us of Your promises and the place You prepare for us. May Your Spirit overflow within us, casting out fear and filling us with confident hope. Strengthen us and our loved ones by this hope today and always. In Jesus' name, Amen.







Day 5: Offering Forgiveness and Release









Day 5: Offering Forgiveness and Release

Your Verse

Colossians 3:13 – "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Matthew 18:21–22 "...I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times."







Day 5: Offering Forgiveness and Release

Devotional: Forgiveness frees hearts and fosters peace

Forgiveness is essential when releasing guilt in grief. When death approaches, unresolved hurts and regrets about relationships can surface strongly. The Bible calls us to forgive as we have been forgiven—reflecting God's mercy to others.

Colossians 3:13 encourages patience and forgiveness in our relationships, especially at challenging times. Forgiving a loved one or ourselves releases the heavy chains of guilt and bitterness that hinder peace.

Paul reminds us in **Ephesians 4:32** to embody kindness and compassion, the heart of forgiveness. Jesus' teaching in **Matthew 18:21–22** stretches forgiveness beyond limits, highlighting God's abundant grace.

Practicing forgiveness before loss can bring deep healing to relationships and prepare hearts for parting with peace rather than regret.

Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 46:10 "Be still, and know that I am God."
- Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you..."







Day 6: Surrendering Control to God

Devotional: Trusting God replaces striving with peace

Facing grief and guilt often tempts us to try to control what we cannot. In facing death or the pain of loss, the desire to fix things, make peace, or rewrite past choices can be overwhelming. However, God calls us to surrender control and trust Him fully.

Proverbs 3:5-6 counsel us to lean not on our own understanding but to trust the Lord wholeheartedly. This kind of trust invites God to guide our paths straight—even through confusion and sorrow.

Psalm 46:10 challenges us to be still—to pause our striving—and simply know God is sovereign over life and death. The promise in **Isaiah 41:10** assures us not to fear, for God is present, offering strength and help.

Let surrender replace striving, allowing God's peace to flow in despite grief and guilt.

Reflect and Apply

1.	What areas of my grief or guilt am I trying to control?
2.	How can I practice surrendering these worries to God today?
3.	What does trusting God 'with all my heart' practically look like now?

Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about what it feels like to release control to God.
2.	Identify fears that linger when you consider surrendering fully.
3.	Pray for the faith to trust God's plan, even in uncertainty.

Lord, I confess my struggle to control outcomes in times of grief and guilt. Help me to trust You with all my heart and lean not on my limited understanding. Day 7: XX Walking Forward in Peace

Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 - "Do not be anxious about anything...but present your requests to God...and the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- John 16:33 "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace."







Day 7: 🞇 Walking Forward in Peace

Devotional: God's peace guards hearts for the journey ahead

After walking through grief, guilt, forgiveness, and surrender, God invites us to a new season of peace. *Philippians 4:6-7* encourages us to replace anxiety with prayer—presenting every concern to God. In doing so, we open ourselves to receive a peace that surpasses human understanding.

This divine peace guards our hearts and minds against overwhelming fear or despair. **Isaiah 26:3** confirms that trusting God keeps our minds steadfast and grants perfect peace.

Jesus reminds us in **John 16:33** that peace is possible in the midst of trials because of our connection with Him. As you move forward, embrace this gift and walk with confidence and calm, knowing God's presence steadies your path.
