Day 1: **(**) Embracing a New Identity

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 5:17 – "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past... See, I am doing a new thing!"
- Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works..."







Day 1: V Embracing a New Identity

Devotional: Your Identity Is Found in Christ Alone

Many veterans wrestle with defining themselves beyond their military career.

The uniform and rank have often been central to identity, but 2 Corinthians 5:17 reminds us that in Christ, we become new creations. The past, including former roles and battles, no longer defines who you are.

This is a powerful invitation to let go of old labels and embrace God's new purpose for you. Isaiah 43:18–19 encourages us to stop dwelling on former things—no matter how significant—and to look for the new work God is doing.

God's craftsmanship in you is ongoing. Ephesians 2:10 reminds us that we are created for good works, prepared by God for this new season. You are still invaluable in God's Kingdom, and He has good plans for your life, even now.

As you step into civilian life, remember you have a new identity rooted in Christ. Your worth is no longer tied to your past roles but to the eternal purpose God has for you.

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him..."
- Philippians 1:6 "He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion..."







Devotional: God's Plans Bring Hope and Purpose

It is natural to ask, "What now? What is my purpose after years of service?" God's Word offers assurance that He has plans full of hope even when life takes unexpected turns.

Jeremiah 29:11 serves as a cornerstone promise, reminding veterans that God's plans are intentional, prosperous, and hopeful. These plans transcend any civilian or military role and focus on an eternal future.

Romans 8:28 reassures us that God is working through every twist and turn to bless those who trust Him. Veterans can trust that even in career changes or identity shifts, God's hand leads the way toward good. Philippians 1:6 encourages us further by affirming God's faithfulness to finish what He started—He continues to shape you for His glory.

Devotional: Use Your Unique Gifts to Serve Others

Day 4: Bestoring Your Soul and Spirit

Your Verse

Psalm 23:3 - "He restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength..."







Day 4: B Restoring Your Soul and Spirit

Devotional: Allow God to Restore and Renew You

Transitioning to civilian life can drain the soul and spirit with uncertainty and change. Psalm 23:3 offers profound comfort: God restores our souls and leads us in right paths.

Jesus invites weary veterans today to find rest and renewal in Him (Matthew 11:28). You don't have to carry the burdens of your past or future alone.

Isaiah 40:31 promises fresh strength for those who hope in the Lord. As a veteran, you may have given your all for many years, but God's grace renews and equips you continually. Allow Him to refresh your mind, emotions, and spirit.

Taking time for spiritual and emotional restoration is vital to embracing your new purpose and Kingdom assignment. Let God's peace and strength refill you daily.

Prayer for Today

Devotional: Serve Others and Reflect God's Love

Service has been a core part of your military life, and God continues to call you to serve with compassion in your Kingdom assignment. Galatians 6:9-10 encourages perseverance in doing good despite challenges or fatigue.

Serving others is a tangible way to express God's love and fulfill your purpose. Matthew 25:40 powerfully reminds us that when we serve those in need, we serve Jesus Himself.

Hebrews 13:16 exhorts believers not to forget acts of kindness and sharing. Your experiences, empathy, and selflessness position you to minister in significant ways to people around you.

Keep pressing on in service, knowing that your efforts have eternal impact and that God honors your faithfulness.

2.	Write about specific ways to show compassion this week.
3.	Reflect on how serving others connects to your faith.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for the privilege to serve others. Help me to persevere in kindness and compassion, reflecting Your love in every opportunity. Day 6: 6 Strengthened by God's Power

Your Verse

Ephesians 3:16 – "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."







Day 6: 6 Strengthened by God's Power

Devotional: God's Spirit Empowers You Boldly

Facing a new season may ignite feelings of insecurity or weakness, but the Holy Spirit empowers veterans with divine strength. Ephesians 3:16 is a beautiful prayer reminding us that God desires to strengthen our inner being by His Spirit.

God's power replaces timidity with boldness, love, and self-control as stated in 2 Timothy 1:7, enabling you to step confidently into your Kingdom assignment.

Philippians 4:13 affirms that all things—including new challenges—are possible through Christ's strength. You are not alone in this transition; God's power is available daily to sustain and guide you.

Invite the Holy Spirit to fill you anew and empower you to walk in confidence and purpose going forward.

Devotional: Commit to Finishing Your God-Given Race
