Devotional: Embracing God's Strength to Be Content

Devotional: Clinging to Hope in God's Promises

Hope anchors our hearts when prayers seem unanswered—especially in singleness. God's promise in Jeremiah 29:11 reminds us that He knows the future He has prepared for us, a future filled with hope and purpose.

Romans 8:28 strengthens our confidence that in every circumstance, including waiting or loneliness, God is orchestrating good for those who love Him. This is not always easy to see in the moment but trusting this truth brings courage and faith.
