Your Verse

Matthew 11:28 - "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Devotional: Accepting God's Rest Amidst Parenting Chaos

As parents, weariness is a familiar companion. From early mornings to late nights, the endless to-do list and constant care can leave us feeling drained. Yet, Jesus extends an open invitation to all who are weary: "Come to me... and I will give you rest." Day 2: Palancing Work and Rest

Devotional: Embracing God's Rhythm of Work and Rest

God's design for balance includes both work and rest. From creation, He set an example by working six days and resting on the seventh. The Sabbath isn't just a day off—it's a sacred rhythm inviting us to pause, reflect, and restore.

For busy parents, this balance can seem impossible to achieve. The demands of caregiving, household chores, and possibly employment can overshadow the need for intentional rest. Yet Jesus exemplified this balance by withdrawing with His disciples to quiet places for rest and renewal.

Remembering the Sabbath means more than a day; it's a mindset to honor God by prioritizing rest alongside responsibilities. This day, ask yourself how to steward your time well to reflect God's rhythm and rely on Him to sustain you.

- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Devotional: God's Strength Perfected in Our Weakness

Parenting reveals both our strengths and our limitations. There are moments when exhaustion or discouragement overwhelms us. Yet Paul's words remind us that God's grace meets us exactly in our weakness.

When we admit we are not enough, God's power fills in the gaps. His strength is not only sufficient, it is perfected in our weakness—meaning our limitations invite His limitless strength to shine through.

This truth offers profound rest to busy parents: you don't have to rely on your energy alone. Instead, in your moments of fatigue, lean into God's grace and power. He will strengthen your heart and renew your spirit to carry out your calling lovingly and faithfully.

Devotional: Resting in God's Unshakable Peace
