A 7-day Bible study for teens coping with a loved one's illness, offering comfort, hope, and guidance through Scripture and prayer.





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Introduction

Facing the illness of someone you love can be one of the most challenging experiences in life, especially as a teen. You might feel overwhelmed by emotions like fear, sadness, confusion, or even anger. It's important to remember that these feelings are normal, and you are not alone. *Bible scripture offers encouragement and strength* to help you navigate this difficult journey. Through this 7-day study plan, you'll discover God's promises of comfort, hope, and peace that can carry you through the tough days.

As a teen, you may also feel isolated or unsure of how to express what you're experiencing. This plan will not only provide you with Scripture to meditate on but also reflections and journaling exercises to help you process your feelings. You will learn how to bring your worries and pains to God in prayer, trusting Him to be your refuge.

Remember, God's love never fails, even when life is uncertain. Each day, you'll be encouraged to seek Him, rest in His peace, and discover the hope that comes from knowing He cares deeply for both you and your loved one. Lean in, be honest with God, and allow these truths to strengthen your heart.

















Your Verse

Isaiah 41:10 – So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 31:8 The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you;
- Psalm 46:1 God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.







Devotional: God's Presence in Your Fear

When a loved one is sick, fear can grip your heart. What if things get worse? How do you handle the uncertainty?

Isaiah 41:10 reminds us directly not to fear because God is with us. This assurance means you don't have to face your fears alone. God's promise to be by your side isn't only for adults—it's for teens like you, too, who might feel scared or helpless right now.

God's presence brings comfort even when circumstances are difficult. His steady hand is there to hold you through the storms. Whenever doubts or worries arise, remember to turn your eyes toward Him. Speak to Him honestly, telling Him your fears and asking for peace.

Trusting God doesn't mean your problems disappear immediately, but it means you will never have to carry them alone. Let His presence be your strength today.

Prayer for Today

Dear God, Thank You for Your promise to never leave me, especially when I am afraid. Please help me to feel Your presence today. Teach me to trust You more even when I don't understand what is happening. Carry me through the hard moments and help me find peace in Your love. I lift up my loved one to You and ask for Your healing and strength over their body. Thank You for being my refuge and my strength. Amen. \bigwedge

















Day 2: Prinding Hope in God's Promises

Your Verse

Romans 15:13 - May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Supporting Scriptures

- Jeremiah 29:11 I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you.
- Psalm 33:22 May your unfailing love be with us, LORD, even as we put our hope in you.







Day 2: Pinding Hope in God's Promises

Devotional: Hope That Overflows

Hope can feel fragile when someone you love is sick. You might worry about the future or feel overwhelmed by the unknown. Yet, Romans 15:13 invites us to receive a deep, lasting hope that comes from God Himself.

This hope is not just wishful thinking; it is the confidence that God is in control, and He is working for good even in difficult circumstances. When you choose to trust God, He fills your heart with joy and peace that can overflow beyond your circumstances.

Think about what hope looks like for you today. It could be believing in a better tomorrow, trusting God's plans even when they're unclear, or knowing that you are never alone in your struggles.

Hold tightly to God's promises and let His Holy Spirit fill you with courage and peace, guiding you through this challenging time.

Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 - Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you.
- Psalm 94:19 When anxiety was great within me, your consolation brought me joy.







Day 3: Peace That Guards Your Heart

Devotional: Receiving God's Peace Today

Anxiety and worry are natural responses when someone we love is sick. The pressures of school, family, and emotions can also add up, making peace seem so far away.

Yet, Philippians 4:6-7 gives us a practical way to experience God's peace. We are encouraged to bring everything—our worries, questions, and fears—to God in prayer with thanksgiving.

This peace God gives won't always take immediate problems away, but it protects your heart and mind like a shield, calming your spirit even in uncertainty.

Try to make time today to talk honestly with God, sharing your concerns and thanking Him for His love and care. As you do, ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with peace that nothing can steal.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 – My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:29 He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.
- Psalm 73:26 My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart.







Day 4: 7 Strength in Weakness

Devotional: God's Power in Your Weakness

It can feel like weakness when you're tired, overwhelmed, or unsure how to help someone who is sick. You may think you need to have all the answers or be strong all the time.

But 2 Corinthians 12:9 reassures us that God's grace is enough, and His power shows itself most clearly when we are weak. When you feel unable or helpless, that is the very moment God wants to show His strength through you.

Lean into your weakness as a place where God can work miracles of comfort and courage, not just for your loved one but for yourself and others around you.

Ask God to fill you with His strength and grace so you can face each day with renewed energy and hope.

Lord, Thank You that Your grace is enough for me. When I feel weak or tired, please remind me that Your power is made perfect in those moments. Strengthen my heart and help me to rely on You instead of my own abilities. Let Your presence carry me and show Your glory through my weakness. I trust You are working in and through me even now. Day 5: *Comforting Others in Need

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 1:3-4 - Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles.

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 6:2 Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.
- Romans 12:15 Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.







Day 5: *Comforting Others in Need

Devotional: Becoming a Source of Comfort

As you go through hard times with a sick loved one, you might also notice others around you who are hurting.

2 Corinthians 1:3–4 highlights that God is the ultimate source of comfort, and He uses us to comfort others. Your experiences, even your pain, can become a way to encourage and support friends, family, or others going through difficulties.

Sometimes, simply being present, listening, and showing kindness is the best way to share God's comfort.

Reflect on how you can be a light to those around you today, sharing the compassion God has shown to you. This not only helps others but can also bring healing to your own heart.

Your Verse

Ecclesiastes 3:1 - There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens.

Supporting Scriptures

- Habakkuk 2:3 For the vision is yet for an appointed time; it hastens toward the goal and will not lie.
- Psalm 27:14 Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD.







Devotional: Patience in God's Perfect Plan

Waiting can be one of the hardest parts when a loved one is sick. You may wish for quick answers or healing, but often, life moves according to God's timing, which can be different from what we want.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that God has a perfect time for everything. Learning to trust His timing requires patience and faith in His good plans.

Even when it's hard to wait, remember that God sees the bigger picture and is always working for your ultimate good. You can take heart knowing that the seasons of life, including pain and healing, have meaning and purpose.

Ask God to help you wait patiently, trusting He is in control and that His timing is perfect.







Reflect and Apply

1.	How do you feel about waiting during your loved one's illness?
2.	What have you learned about God's timing so far?
3.	How can you keep hope alive while waiting?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about your feelings around waiting.
2.	Describe what trusting God's timing looks like for you.
3.	List ways to remind yourself to be patient and hopeful.







Prayer for Today

Father, waiting is hard, but I choose to trust Your perfect timing. Help me be patient and strong while I wait on You. Teach me to believe that You are working everything for good, even if I don't understand now. Please give me hope and comfort during this season. I surrender my schedule and plans to You. In Jesus' name, Amen. Σ

















Your Verse

Lamentations 3:22–23 – Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 100:5 His love endures forever, and his faithfulness continues through all generations.
- Hebrews 10:23 Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess.







Devotional: Hope Anchored in God's Love

As this study comes to a close, it's important to remember that God's love and faithfulness never end, no matter what happens.

Lamentations 3:22–23 emphasizes that God's compassion renews every morning. Even when you feel tired or discouraged, you can celebrate a new day filled with His steadfast love.

Keep holding on to the hope and peace you have cultivated this week. Let God's faithfulness be your anchor through every storm.

Remember that God cares not only for your loved one but also for your heart. He will continue to be your refuge and strength forever.

How can you celebrate God's faithfulness daily?
In what ways can you share God's love with others moving forward?

1.	Write a gratitude list focused on God's faithfulness.
2.	Describe how God has been your refuge in tough times.
3.	Plan one way you can encourage others with God's love.
