Psalm 34:17 – "The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 55:22 "Cast your cares on the LORD and he will sustain you; he will never let the righteous be shaken."
- 1 Peter 5:7 "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."







Devotional: Finding Peace by Casting Your Cares on God

Feeling overly dependent or anxious can drain your energy and cloud your mind. Yet the Bible reminds us that God is intimately aware of every burden we carry. Psalm 34:17 assures us that when we cry out to God, He listens and brings deliverance.

For someone experiencing DPD, trusting others might feel safer than trusting oneself, but trusting God brings a deeper, unshakable peace. He invites us to cast our anxieties on Him, because He truly cares for our wellbeing.

Today, reflect on what it means to surrender your worries to God. Instead of fearing indecision or uncertainty, invite God's steady presence to fill you with calm and confidence.

When your heart feels fragile, remember you are not alone—God's care is constant and strong.

Prayer for Today

Dear Lord, thank You for hearing my cries and inviting me to cast my anxieties on You. Help me to trust Your unfailing care even when I feel weak or uncertain. Teach me to rely on Your strength as I navigate my dependence and fears. Fill me with peace that surpasses understanding and guard my heart against doubt. May I feel Your presence ever near, comforting and sustaining me. **In Jesus' name, Amen.**















Your Verse

Philippians 4:13 - "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: Embracing God's Strength in Your Weakness

Dependent Personality Disorder can make decision-making and independence feel intimidating. However, Scripture encourages us that true strength does not come solely from ourselves but from God through Christ.

Philippians 4:13 reminds us that with Christ's strength, we can face challenges that otherwise feel impossible. God's power grows strongest in our weaknesses; this paradox invites us to lean less on our own insecurities and more on Him.

Today, consider where you feel weakest or most dependent. Present these areas to God, asking Him to empower and guide your steps forward.

Through faith, personal growth begins as God strengthens your courage and confidence from the inside out.

- Isaiah 58:11 "The LORD will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame."







Devotional: Trusting God to Guide Your Decisions

Those with Dependent Personality Disorder may struggle with trusting their own judgment, often relying heavily on others. Yet God invites us to place full trust in Him, even when understanding feels incomplete.

Proverbs 3:5-6 encourages us to lean not on our own limits but on God's infinite wisdom. When we submit our plans to Him, He promises to direct our paths clearly and lovingly.

Today, ask God to guide you through difficult decisions, big or small. Seek His counsel through prayer and the Scriptures, and be open to His gentle leading.

Allow God's guidance to become your anchor, even when your own clarity feels uncertain.

Living with Dependent Personality Disorder can sometimes cause feelings of inadequacy and low self-worth. Yet the Bible boldly declares that each of us is fearfully and wonderfully made by a loving Creator.

Psalm 139:14 is a powerful reminder that our value is intrinsic and known fully by God, even before birth. Your identity is not defined by your struggles or dependence but by the purpose God has woven into your life.

Today, reflect on the truth of who you are in God's eyes. Rejoice that you are unique, loved deeply, and created for meaningful work through Christ.

Allow this realization to empower you to walk forward with dignity and hope.
