# Following Jesus: Baptism, Identity, and Overcoming Temptation



Explore Jesus' baptism and temptation to discover His identity and learn how to resist temptation through God's Word in this 21-day journey.





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#### Introduction

This event sets the foundation for Jesus' mission and reveals His unique identity. As we study these passages, we'll understand more deeply what it means to belong to God and embrace His calling in our own lives.

Immediately following his baptism, Jesus faces temptation in the wilderness.

Here, He demonstrates how to use the Word of God to resist the enemy's attacks. Often, temptation is a critical test that prepares us to live out our faith with strength and integrity. Through Jesus' example, we learn practical ways to stand firm by grounding ourselves in scripture and relying on the Spirit's power.

This study offers daily readings, supporting verses, and reflective questions that will help you deepen your relationship with God. Whether you're seeking encouragement, strength to overcome challenges, or a clearer understanding of Jesus' identity and mission, these 21 days will lead you to a richer, more confident walk with Christ.







Prepare your heart to encounter Jesus anew. May His Word inspire and empower you each day as you follow His example of obedience, trust, and spiritual victory.

Often, we struggle with feelings of unworthiness or doubt. Yet, the voice from heaven reminds us that being loved and accepted by God is not based on performance or accomplishments but on His grace. Embracing this truth frees us to walk boldly into our calling, secure in God's pleasure and favor.

#### Devotional: Entering the Wilderness with the Spirit

Led by the Spirit after His baptism, He spends forty days fasting and praying—arming Himself spiritually before beginning His public ministry. This period models for us that preparation often involves solitude, discipline, and dependence on God's Word.

Fasting is more than abstaining from food; it's a spiritual discipline that heightens our awareness of God and minimizes distractions. In seasons of challenge or decision, we can intentionally seek the Lord's presence and guidance as Jesus did.

The enemy's first tactic is to exploit physical hunger, urging Jesus to misuse His power for self-pleasure. Jesus counters with scripture, affirming that true life depends on God's Word, not simply physical needs. This teaches us the importance of prioritizing spiritual nourishment.

Temptations often target our immediate desires, but Jesus models how to respond with unwavering trust in God's promises. Memorizing and meditating on scripture equips us to recognize and resist lies and shortcuts.

## Devotional: True Power is Found in Worship

The enemy offers Jesus dominion over all kingdoms in exchange for worship, tempting Him with instant authority. Jesus rejects this offer by reaffirming exclusive worship to God alone. This temptation exposes the desire for control and shortcuts to achieve influence.

In our lives, the lure of power, recognition, or self-sufficiency can sidetrack our devotion to God. Jesus' response reminds us that true power is found in humility and worship—not in compromise or shortcuts.

What areas of your life are vulnerable to the temptation of control or pride? How can you practice surrender and worship instead of seeking your own ways?
