Introduction

Each day offers scripture, devotional thoughts, reflection questions, journaling prompts, and prayer to guide you in responding fully to Christ's call.

Prepare your heart to be challenged and encouraged — to step beyond comfort into a new life of faith and action. Whether you're new to following Jesus or have walked with Him for years, this study invites you to re-examine your own calling and experience how God's transformative power still works through ordinary people to impact the world.

Day 1: X Called to Follow









Your Verse

Matthew 4:18-20 - "As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 1:17 "Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people."
- Luke 5:10 "Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people."







Devotional: Answering the Call to Follow Jesus

Jesus' invitation to Peter and Andrew was simple yet profound: 'Come, follow me.' This call disrupted their ordinary, familiar life of fishing and beckoned toward a new journey with eternal significance. The disciples' immediate response—leaving their nets behind—shows what it means to trust Jesus even when the future is uncertain. This first step is one of faith and obedience, a willingness to set aside worldly pursuits for God's kingdom purposes.

How often do we hesitate to follow Jesus because we can't see all the details ahead? Yet Scripture reminds us that the call to follow is a personal invitation to join Jesus in His mission, not just a command to do good works. The compelling power of the call is His promise to transform and empower us to impact lives.

Today, consider what nets or routine you may need to leave behind to truly follow Christ. Trust that Jesus sees your potential and wants you—a whole, ordinary person—to engage in His extraordinary mission.

Devotional: The Cost and Courage of Following

Following Jesus often demands difficult choices—sometimes even leaving behind the familiar and comfortable. When Peter and the other disciples left their boats and livelihoods, they demonstrated radical obedience and trust. This decision was more than a physical action; it symbolized letting go of old identities, security, and plans to embrace God's new calling.

Jesus' call challenges us today to examine what we are holding onto that hinders our full devotion. What are we afraid to leave behind? Our habits, relationships, ambitions, or comforts? Discipleship is costly, but the reward is abundant life in Christ.

As you reflect on your own journey, ask God to reveal what sacrifices you must make. Remember, what we leave behind gains eternal value when placed in God's hands.

Devotional: No One is Beyond Jesus' Call

Jesus called Matthew, a tax collector despised by society, to be His disciple, demonstrating that nobody is outside of God's invitation. This reminds us that Jesus' call crosses social, moral, and cultural boundaries. He meets us right where we are, no matter our past or status.

This day invites you to consider how Jesus might be calling you despite your imperfections or background. His grace breaks through barriers and transforms lives. Like Matthew, responding to Jesus can redirect the course of your life and influence others.

Take heart in knowing Jesus calls the unlikely, the overlooked, and the ordinary to serve in His extraordinary mission.

Day 4: 🛕 Leaving the Past Behind









Your Verse

Philippians 3:13-14 - "But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here!"
- Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past."







Devotional: Straining Toward the Goal in Christ

The disciples left old lives behind to pursue a new mission with Jesus. Similarly, Paul's words remind us that following Christ requires forgetting what held us captive and focusing on the future God has for us.

Leaving the past isn't always easy; memories, guilt, and old patterns can weigh heavily. But God invites us to press on, looking ahead to the eternal prize and the purpose He has set before us.

As you reflect today, ask God for strength to release the past and move forward with intention and hope. Your past does not define you—Christ does.


