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Introduction

Devotional: Answering Jesus' Call to Follow

Peter's story starts on the shores of Galilee with an extraordinary call. As a fisherman, Peter's life was defined by his daily work—casting nets, catching fish, and providing for his family. But when Jesus saw him, He invited Peter into a radically new purpose: to leave his nets and follow Him to become a fisher of men.

This moment reminds us that Jesus meets us in the ordinary and calls us to something extraordinary. Peter didn't hesitate despite the risks. This teaches us about the importance of *responding to God's call with trust*, stepping out even when the future is uncertain.

Reflect on your own calling. Are there areas where Jesus is inviting you to follow Him more closely? Like Peter, will you leave behind old securities to embrace His new mission?

Devotional: Faith in the Storms of Life

Peter's faith was often bold but impulsive. When Jesus walked on the water and invited him to come, Peter stepped out in courage. Yet, when the wind and waves frightened him, his faith faltered, and he began to sink.

This beautiful story reveals the tension between faith and fear in our walk with God. We can be quick to trust and quick to doubt. Peter's cry, 'Lord, save me!' shows us that it's okay to admit when our faith is weak and to reach out for Jesus' help.

Jesus immediately reached out and saved Peter. God meets us in our moments of fear and weakness and invites us to keep our eyes on Him. Peter's impulsiveness reminds us that faith is a journey, sometimes marked by stumbles, but God's grace is constant.

This event marked a new chapter in Peter's life where his limitations were overcome by divine empowerment.

We often face challenges feeling inadequate or afraid. But just as Peter received the Holy Spirit's power, we too are invited to be filled and enabled to live out God's purpose.

Reflect on how the Holy Spirit works in your life. Are you open to receiving His guidance, strength, and wisdom? Like Peter, the Spirit equips us not for our convenience, but for bold, faithful witness in a world that needs hope.

Day 4: T Denial and Restoration

Devotional: Grace Beyond Failure

One of the most human moments in Peter's journey is his denial of Jesus.

Despite his bold claims, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times during the

crucifixion trial. This failure must have devastated him.

Yet, Jesus' love and restoration were greater than Peter's failure. After the resurrection, Jesus lovingly reaffirmed Peter's calling by asking him three times if he loved Him and commissioning him to "feed my lambs."

This story teaches us that failure is not the end. God's grace can restore and renew our purpose. We are invited to come back to Him with repentant hearts and receive forgiveness and new beginnings.

Devotional: Bold Faith Amid Opposition

Peter's boldness was tested when he and John were arrested for preaching about Jesus. Faced with threats, Peter confidently declared, 'We cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard.'

This courage comes from a deep conviction that the gospel's truth is worth any cost. Peter models a fearless faith that trusts God's sovereign protection over human threats.

Persecution may bring fear, but God calls us to stand firm and bless those who suffer for righteousness. This requires relying on the Spirit's power to overcome timidity, just as Peter did.
