The miracle that follows reminds us that God's provisions exceed human calculations. Like Philip, we sometimes see problems as too big, but Jesus urges us to trust in Him.

May we learn to hold both realism and faith together, trusting God to do what only He can when we bring our doubts honestly before Him.
