Devotional: Guard Your Heart to Nourish Purity

The battle against lust begins in the heart. Proverbs 4:23 highlights the importance of guarding your inner life because everything you do originates from there. Lust often starts with a glance or thought and grows if left unchecked. Jesus teaches in Matthew 5:28 that lustful intent is already sin in the heart—not just an action to avoid.

Guarding your heart means being vigilant about what you allow to shape your thoughts and emotions. Purity is not just an external behavior but a condition of the heart, shaped by God's Word. James 4:7 encapsulates the victory strategy: submit to God, resist the devil, and he must flee. This submission and resistance work together to secure your freedom. Today, consciously put on God's armor to stand strong in this fight.

Devotional: Shift Your Desires Toward God

Devotional: Let Love Replace Lust
