A 21-day Bible study plan addressing mental health challenges through God's Word, focusing on healing from pornography addiction and restoring wholeness.





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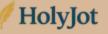








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Introduction

Start memorizing verses, meditate regularly on God's promises, and invite the Holy Spirit to guide your thinking. Over time, your brain and heart will align with God's truth, empowering you to walk in freedom.

In what ways have you experienced peace when focusing on God- centered thoughts?





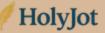

Imagine your heart as a garden. What weeds are growing that need to be uprooted? What good seeds are you planting? Being proactive about heartguarding can dramatically reduce vulnerability and increase your mental health and spiritual vitality.

Ask God to reveal hidden areas that need protection and commit to daily spiritual habits that build resilience. This is a vital step on the path toward freedom.
