Day 1: 🎇 Identity Beyond Approval

Your Verse

Galatians 1:10 – "Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 5:44 "How can you believe since you accept glory from one another but do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?"
- Psalm 139:14 "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."







Day 1: 🎇 Identity Beyond Approval

Devotional: Choosing God's Approval Over People's

Many believers unknowingly live their lives trying to win applause from others rather than seeking God's approval. Addiction to spending for the purpose of impressing others stems from a deep desire to be valued and accepted. But Paul's words in Galatians 1:10 remind us that our true identity and worth come not from human approval but from being servants of Christ.

When we realize that God's approval is the only approval that ultimately matters, it frees us from the exhausting cycle of people-pleasing. This week, reflect on who you are in God's eyes—fearfully and wonderfully made, deeply loved, and uniquely purposed. Allow this truth to reorient your heart and spending habits.

Today, aim to focus your desires on pleasing God alone. Notice when your spending or actions are motivated by human applause and ask God to redirect your heart towards Him.

Your Verse

1 Timothy 6:9-10 - "Those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 6:24 "You cannot serve both God and money."
- Hebrews 13:5 "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have."







Devotional: Recognizing the Trap of Loving Money

Materialism blinds us to the true purpose and freedom God offers. Spending to impress is often fueled by a love of money—a dangerous root that leads to spiritual ruin.

Paul warns Timothy about the temptations that come with the desire to get rich, including foolish and harmful desires. When we prioritize money and possessions over God, we become trapped in a cycle of incessant wanting and striving, never truly satisfied.

Jesus clearly states that we cannot serve both God and money. Today, examine your heart for any materialistic desires and contentions. Challenge the idea that worth or happiness is tied to spending or owning more. Begin practicing contentment, trusting God's provision, and resting in His approval rather than the applause of others.

3.	How can you guard your heart from serving money instead of God?

1.	Reflect on a moment when chasing possessions caused stress or emptiness.

3.	List things you are grateful for that do not cost money.







Prayer for Today

Lord, I confess that I sometimes chase after money and possessions to feel valued and accepted. Help me to see the danger in loving money and to trust in Your provision. *Teach me to be content and to serve You fully, not the lure of wealth.* Free me from the trap of materialism and guide me to true joy in Your presence. Amen.

Day 3: **(**) Guarding Your Heart

Devotional: Protecting Your Inner Life

Your heart is the wellspring of your life. It influences your thoughts, decisions, and actions, including how and why you spend.

Proverbs 4:23 tells us to guard our hearts diligently, especially because they can be easily deceived. Addiction to impressing others often starts with unguarded desires and influences—social pressures, comparisons, insecurity.

Today, focus on protecting your heart by inviting God to renew it and by setting healthy boundaries. Evaluate the influences in your life that drive your spending habits. Ask God to purify your motives and help you reflect His love and approval in every choice.

Devotional: Living in God's Grace and Approval

God's approval is rooted in His grace, not in what we do or own. Ephesians 1:6 reminds us that we are accepted 'to the praise of his glorious grace.'

When we rest in Christ's love and grace, the need to impress others diminishes because our identity is secure in Him. This frees us from striving and from addictions that seek to fill voids only God can satisfy.

Today, meditate on the truth that you are deeply loved and approved by God. Let His grace permeate your heart and renew your desire to live fully for Him rather than for fleeting human applause.





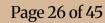

Devotional: Transforming Your Thoughts and Habits

Changing addictive behaviors starts with the mind. Romans 12:2 challenges us not to fall into worldly patterns, especially those driven by desire for external approval.

Renewing your mind involves saturating your thoughts with God's truth and focusing on what is pure and admirable. This mental renewal influences your choices—financial and otherwise—and aligns your heart with God.

Today, identify thought patterns that fuel your urge to spend for applause. Replace them with Scripture and godly truths. Commit to daily meditation on what honors God and strengthens your freedom.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 10:31 "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God."
- Matthew 6:33 "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

Devotional: Serving God Not People

The ultimate freedom is living to please God alone. Colossians 3:23–24 encourages us to work and live wholeheartedly for the Lord, fully aware that He is the one who rewards us.

When your motivations change from impressing people to honoring God, your spending and all life choices reflect eternal values. This results in peace, purpose, and abundant joy.

Today, renew your commitment to live for God's applause rather than human praise. Reflect on ways you can honor Him through your spending, generosity, and lifestyle.
