Isaiah 41:10 – "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- Psalm 34:4 "I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears."







Devotional: God's Presence Dispels Fear and Empowers You

Fear is often the hidden root of addiction. It can whisper lies that we are alone, powerless, or unworthy. Isaiah 41:10 powerfully counters this by reminding us of God's ever–present promise "I am with you." This divine companionship is the foundation of courage.

Recognizing that the Spirit given to us is not for timidity but for *power, love,* and self-discipline (2 Timothy 1:7) equips us for battle against fear-driven behaviors. When we invite God's presence, our courage is strengthened, and the grip of addiction loosens.

Psalm 34:4 encourages us to seek God actively in moments of fear. When we do, He responds and delivers us. Today, your first step toward freedom begins with acknowledging your fears and bringing them to God.

	In what ways can you invite the Spirit's power, love, and self-discipline into your struggles?

Prayer for Today

- Ephesians 4:22–24 "...put off your old self... and put on the new self, created to be like God."







Day 2: A Renewing Your Mind to Break Chains

Devotional: Transform Your Mind to Defeat Addictive Patterns

Addiction often feeds on habitual thought patterns steeped in fear and falsehood. Romans 12:2 invites us to reject worldly patterns and instead experience transformation through renewing our minds.

This renewal is an daily intentional process — choosing what we focus on, what we believe, and how we respond. Paul's encouragement in Philippians 4:8 to meditate on things that are true, noble, and pure helps reshape our thinking into healthier channels.

In Ephesians, believers are reminded to shed the old self—often chained by addiction—and clothe themselves with the new self created according to God's design. As your mind renews, fear-driven cravings and behaviors lose their sting and influence.

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything... the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts."
- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."







Devotional: Embrace God's Peace to Overcome Fear

Addiction can create inner turmoil, gnawing anxiety, and a restless heart. Jesus offers a peace unlike the world's fleeting calm. John 14:27 emphasizes His gift: a peace that removes trouble and fear.

Philippians 4:6-7 instructs us to present our anxieties to God through prayer. In return, God's peace protects our hearts and minds. This divine tranquility shrinks the power that fear and addiction hold.

Moreover, Psalm 46:1 offers solid reassurance—God is your refuge and strength, present in your struggles. Let His peace be a shield that enables you to face each challenge with courage and hope.

Your Verse

- Psalm 119:11 "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you."







Day 4: Preaking Strongholds through Truth

Devotional: Use God's Truth to Tear Down Addiction Strongholds

Addiction often builds strongholds of deception and lies that feel impossible to overcome. However, Scripture assures us that spiritual weapons have divine power to destroy these strongholds.

James 5 stresses the healing power of confession and prayer within a trusted community. Today, consider who supports your journey and how you might deepen accountability. Together, the path to freedom becomes less daunting and more empowering.
