#### Devotional: You Are Wonderfully Made by God

#### Devotional: Choosing God's Approval Over People's

We often find ourselves trapped in the relentless pursuit of approval—from peers, followers, or even strangers scrolling past our latest post. Galatians 1:10 challenges us to consider: are we trying to please people or God? This question pierces the heart of the addiction to selfie culture, where approval can feel like oxygen but leaves us breathless and empty.

John 12:43 warns of the danger in loving human praise more than God's. When our identity depends on the fluctuating opinions of others, we become vulnerable, insecure, and captive. Fear of man can become a snare, but Proverbs 29:25 offers hope—trust in the Lord brings true safety and freedom.

Today, reflect on the chains of validation that might bind you. What would it look like to prioritize God's approval above all? Breaking free is not about rebellion but about reclaiming your true identity and resting in God's faithful acceptance. #### Devotional: Embracing a New Identity in Christ

When the selfie culture tries to define us by the image projected, God calls us to a profound transformation of identity. 2 Corinthians 5:17 reassures us that in Christ, we are made new—our old identity, including the addiction to external validation, is replaced by a fresh start rooted in Him.

Your worth is no longer tied to your outward image but to the God who created you for *good works* (Ephesians 2:10). Your authentic self doesn't need the filters or likes; it is already valued and secured as hidden with Christ in God (Colossians 3:3).

Allow the reality of your new identity in Christ to sink deeply into your heart. This identity provides freedom and peace beyond any photo or social media recognition. You are not your selfie or your follower count—you are God's beloved, renewed and empowered to live out your true purpose.

Strengthen me to live out the good works You have prepared for me and to find confidence and peace in being hidden with You. May Your Spirit remind me daily of who I am in You. *In Your name, Amen.*

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- James 3:16 "Where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice."







#### Devotional: Protect Your Heart Against Comparison

Comparison is often at the root of addiction to selfie culture. Proverbs 4:23 exhorts us to guard our hearts carefully because our actions, emotions, and thoughts stem from what we internalize. When the heart is vulnerable to envy or insecurity, it opens doors to dissatisfaction and unhealthy patterns.

God's Spirit, however, equips us with power, love, and self-discipline (2 Timothy 1:7) that help us resist the temptation to compare ourselves with others. James 3:16 reveals the chaos envy creates—disorder and evil practices that disrupt our peace and relationships.

Today, practice protecting your heart through intentional thought and spiritual discipline. Notice when feelings of envy or comparison arise and invite God's Spirit to replace them with power and love. Guarding your heart is crucial to breaking free from false worth tied to how you measure up online or in person.

#### Devotional: Transform Your Mind with God's Truth

Our mind is a battlefield where the addiction to selfie culture often gains a foothold through lies and negative self-talk. Romans 12:2 encourages transformation through the renewing of our minds—actively changing our thought patterns to align with God's truth rather than the world's fleeting standards.

Paul urges us in Philippians 4:8 to focus on what is true, noble, and pure. This deliberate focus replaces toxic thoughts with virtues that build our identity in Christ. Furthermore, 2 Corinthians 10:5 reminds us that we can take every thought captive and make it obedient to Christ—an empowering call to mental discipline and freedom.

Take time today to identify thoughts influenced by selfie culture and counter them with God's truth. This mental renewal is an ongoing process that strengthens your spirit and releases you from worldly validation's grip.

Day 6: **B** Finding Rest in God's Acceptance

#### Devotional: Resting in Jesus' Peace and Acceptance

The addiction to selfie culture often stems from weariness—weariness of trying to be enough, to look good, or to keep up appearances. Jesus offers a powerful invitation in Matthew 11:28: come to Him and find rest. It's an invitation to lay down the burdens of approval seeking and to find deep, soulsatisfying peace.

Psalm 46:10 calls us to be still, an act that is harder than it sounds in a noisy social media world. Yet in stillness, we encounter God's presence, assurance, and calm. # Day 7: Day Building Confidence on God's Foundation

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- Jeremiah 17:7 "But blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him."







#### Devotional: Trusting God as Your Unshakable Confidence

Confidence rooted in appearance or social media can be as fragile as a sandcastle, easily washed away by criticism or neglect. Psalm 18:2 calls us to anchor our confidence in the Lord, our unshakeable rock and fortress. When God's strength is our refuge, we find a confidence that endures beyond the fleeting approval of others.

Isaiah 26:3 promises perfect peace to those who keep their minds steadfast and trust God—even when outside circumstances fluctuate. Likewise, Jeremiah 17:7 reminds us that true blessing and confidence come from putting our trust in the Lord.

Choose today to build your confidence on God's solid foundation. When you feel your insecurity rising in the face of comparison or the need to be validated online, remember that your worth is secure in the Almighty. This confidence changes the way you see yourself and the world, freeing you from dependency on external praise.

# Devotional: Embracing Freedom Through Forgiveness

Selfie addiction and the struggle for approval can sometimes lead to bitterness—toward ourselves or toward others who seem more accepted or admired. Ephesians 4:31–32 calls us to release bitterness and embrace kindness and forgiveness as God has forgiven us.

Forgiveness is a gateway to freedom. It unburdens our hearts and removes the obstacles that prevent us from fully embracing God's love and our worth. Colossians 3:13 reminds us to forgive others as the Lord forgave us, and Jesus' teaching in Matthew 6:14 promises that forgiving is essential to experiencing God's forgiveness in return.

**Today, examine any bitterness or unforgiveness you may hold.** Asking God to help you forgive can be difficult but is vital for breaking addictions tied to insecurity and comparison. Walk in the freedom Jesus offers by releasing what binds your heart.

1 Timothy 6:6 connects godliness with contentment as great gain, shifting the focus from external success to spiritual richness. Hebrews 13:5 encourages us to be free from love of things, including fame or appearance, embracing satisfaction in God's provision.
